PROCEEDINGS OF THE ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL DIOCESAN CONVENTION

The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida, Inc. January 25, 2020

The business session of the 177th Annual Convention of the Diocese of Florida began at 10:00 a.m. in the Snell/McCarty Youth Pavilion at the Camp Weed and Cerveny Conference Center with a Call to Order by the chair, the **Rt. Rev. Samuel Johnson Howard**, Eighth Bishop of Florida. **Bishop Howard** welcomed everyone to the convention and stated that the business meeting would be held in the context of Holy Eucharist with the work of the convention as the offering.

Bishop Howard introduced the Chaplain, The Rev. Beth Pessah and the Rev. Deacon Mike Barbare.

Bishop Howard introduced the Opening Hymn, "When the Saints Go Marching In", performed by the Gentle River Bluegrass Band and sung by all.

Bishop Howard introduced the Chair of the Committee of the Dispatch of Business, **The Rev. Cn. Nancy Suellau** who moved to adopt the Rules of Order contained in the Diocesan Journal and posted with the Convention materials, as the Rules of Order for the 177th Annual Convention of the Diocese of Florida. Be it further resolved where the present Rules of Order are silent on a particular subject they shall be augmented by the Articles of Reincorporation of the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida and Robert's Rules of Order. **The Rev. Cn. Nancy Suellau** moved to adopt the Agenda for the 177th Annual Convention of the Diocese of Florida. Be it further resolved that the Agenda for the 177th Annual Convention of the Diocese of Florida be amended by the president only on non-legislative matters and in order to expedite the business of the Convention.

Bishop Howard called for a vote to adopt The Rules of Order and Agenda. Both were accepted by Affirmative Vote.

Bishop Howard recognized **Mr. Jack Araman**, chair of the Credentials Committee for the Certification of Delegates. **Mr. Araman** announced there is a quorum of clergy and duly elected delegates.

Bishop Howard addressed the 177th Convention and opened his comments by thanking those who were instrumental in planning today's gathering, the staff at the Diocesan office and at Camp Weed, and then discussed the many ways that we can be part of "bringing the Good News" in and throughout our Diocese.

Sharing the good news of Christ with others is a call we all share. All else pales in comparison. Bishop Howard asked everyone to reflect on where our attention has been focused recently; what has fed us; what has energized us in our respective ministries, what gives us the most joy. And conversely, what has drained us. Bishop Howard went on to discuss the important place that bringing the good news has in our lives, recognizing that we all have complicated lives. We are all in need. We not only share a community of pain but we are also members of a community of hope. We rejoice in Jesus and delight in sharing the Good News to the poor, oppressed, etc. We rejoice because we believe the Good News. Bishop Howard summarizes the Good News: "I've seen, I know, I've come to deliver you". Our need unlocks the heart of God. Nothing can separate us from His love. This is the message and truth that must be shared. It must be at the center of everything we do. We have the same needs as people did 3,000 years ago. They lived and preached the Gospel and we need to convey that same truth and hope to others. If we believe the Great Commission, then we do it – we share the Good News. Make it the focus of all you do. Bishop Howard challenged us to never preach a sermon that doesn't define our need and the promise of how God eases our pain. Now is the time to fill our life and ministry with the Good News of Christ; to sit at the feet of Christ and experience the love and mercy of Christ. And then share that with others.

Bishop Howard recognized **Mr. Jack Tull**, Vice-Chair of the Diocesan Council, to present Resolution 2020-001(R) - "15% Asking"

Whereas, historically, the Diocesan Asking of General Convention for contributions to the budget of The Episcopal Church (TEC) by a diocese has been at 19%. General Convention Resolution 2015-D013 was a compromise that lowered the Diocesan Asking to 15% along with a change to TEC Title I Canon I.4.6(f) which now reads "Full payment of the diocesan assessment(asking) shall be required of all Dioceses, effective January 1, 2019" The idea was that if all dioceses paid the 15% Asking then TEC Budget would be met. The diocesan asking percentage is set by General Convention.

2018 General Convention Resolution A225 (Adopt the Budget of The Episcopal Church) asks the following: "The funding policy for the period January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2021 is adopted based on a single Asking of the dioceses. After a \$140,000 exemption from total income, a single Asking shall be applied at a flat rate of 15%, in each year 2019, 2020 and 2021 of the balance of income to the diocese, reported in the diocesan financial statements for the year two years prior to the year to which the pledge is applied." The Episcopal Diocese of Florida is 1 of 6 out of 103 domestic dioceses of TEC that does not pay the full 15% Asking. The Diocese of Florida currently pays 10.7%. The Finance Committee of the Executive Council of TEC has graciously allowed dioceses not currently at the 15% Asking level to request a waiver if the diocese makes a commitment to move towards the full asking. Failure to receive such a waiver shall render the diocese ineligible to receive grants or loans from the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society (The Episcopal Church) unless approved by Executive Council. This would include UTO grants.

Resolved, The Episcopal Diocese of Florida shall move towards the required 15% Asking to The Episcopal Church as follows: 11% 2020 12% 2021 13% 2022 14% 2023 15% 2024 and future years.

Resolved, In support and furtherance of the purpose of this resolution, the parishes and missions of the Diocese of Florida shall move towards an 11.25% Asking to the Diocese of Florida as follows: 10.25% 2020 / 10.50% 2021 / 10.75% 2022 / 11.00% 2023 /11.25% 2024 and future years.

Rationale: Parish giving to the diocese does not match diocesan giving to The Episcopal Church dollar for dollar. This is a giving on a percentage of a percentage basis. Acknowledging and understanding that money is most effective in ministry at the local level, and still wanting to make sure diocesan ministries are not the only ministries adversely affected by the change in canonical giving requirements, the churches will support the diocesan budget in a way that makes upstream giving revenue neutral.

Resolved, The Bishop of Florida will appoint a representative(s) to work with The Rev. Mally Ewing Lloyd, Chair of Executive Council's Finance and Assessment Review Committee to submit the required paperwork to grant a waiver to the Diocese of Florida for the 2019-2021 and 2022-2024 triennials. The appointment will remain in effect as needed until the full asking is being paid by the Diocese of Florida.

After a call for a vote, the resolution failed.

Bishop Howard called on **The Rev. Cn. Lance Horne**, Secretary of Convention, to present the General Convention resolutions. Bishop Howard introduced **The Rev. Abi Moon**, Associate Rector of St. Johns Episcopal Church in Tallahassee who shared information on the "Thousand Days of Love" campaign launched by Episcopal Relief & Development. **Rev. Moon** shared that this campaign is designed to raise awareness about the needs of a child's first 1000 days of life and is running from 9/4/2019 – 5/31/2022. Bishop Howard introduced **Mr. Ben Hill**, Diocesan Treasurer who reported on the 2019 financial results. Pledges from parishes, while slightly underplan, comprise the largest percentage of income (63%). Income from the Nehemiah Fund and the Foundation provided approximately 22% of total support, enabling year end actual income to fall just under plan at \$3,444,186. Common Ministry expenses were 10% less than plan leading to a year end net change in assets of \$370,531.

Bishop Howard introduced **Mr. George Hinchliffe**, chair of the **Common Ministry Budget Committee** who presented the 2020 Common Ministry Budget with a motion for acceptance by the Diocesan Council. The 2020 budget presents a breakeven plan with total support of \$2.82 million versus total expenses of \$2.82 million, a difference of \$303.00. The motion carried and the budget was approved as presented.

Bishop Howard asked for a round of applause to thank **Mr. Hill** and **Mr. Hinchliffe** for their service as they are both stepping down from their respective roles.

RULES OF ORDER

I. THE HOLY SCRIPTURES

 As an indication of the humble dependence upon the Word and Spirit of God, and following the example of primitive Councils, a copy of the Holy Scripture shall always be reverently placed in view at the meetings of this Convention. This rule is to be carried into effect under the supervision of the Bishop and Secretary of the Convention.

II. OPENING OF THE DAILY SESSION

- 1. The daily sessions of the Convention shall be opened with prayer, and prayer for Mission and Ministry shall be had daily at noon.
- 2. Unless otherwise ordered by majority vote the Minutes of the preceding day's session shall not be read; but, in lieu thereof the same shall be certified by the Secretary of the Convention.

III. COMMITTEE ON CREDENTIALS

- 1. The President having taken the Chair, the Committee on Credentials shall present its report certifying a quorum is present for the transaction of business.
- 2. A quorum is being defined as (a) one-half of the clergy in good standing having cure in the Diocese and (b) one-half of the lay delegates, both orders properly registered and entitled to vote in the matters coming before the Diocesan Convention.
- 3. The Committee on Credentials shall make a Courtesy Resolution giving a seat and voice to those appropriate persons not otherwise seated on the Convention floor.

IV. AGENDA

- 1. The Agenda for the Convention shall be presented by the Committee on the Dispatch of Business adopted by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 2. The President may modify the Agenda in order to ensure the orderly and timely presentation of Commission Committee Reports; however, the time of elections and the debate of resolutions may not be changed without prior notice, and by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 3. During Convention, the President may appoint such committees as he may deem necessary to expedite the disposition of business.

V. MOTIONS IN ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

- 1. The following motions shall have priority in the order listed. The mover --
 - cannot interrupt a member who has the floor;
 - must be recognized; and
 - the motion must be seconded.

Motions are subject to the following further rules:

- a. To Adjourn or to Recess
 - (1) Not debatable, if unqualified.
 - (2) Not amendable.
 - (3) Cannot be laid on a table.
 - (4) May not be renewed after progress.
 - (5) Majority vote.
 - (6) The motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except that it shall not be offered when another member has the floor.
- b. To Lay on Table or to Table
 - (1) Not debatable.
 - (2) Not amendable.
 - (3) Cannot be laid on table.
 - (4) May be renewed after progress.
 - (5) Majority Vote.
- c. To Extend Debate
 - (1) Not debatable.
 - (2) Amendable, as to time, if a time specified.
 - (3) Cannot be laid on table.
 - (4) May be renewed after progress.
 - (5) Two-thirds majority vote.
 - (6) When applied to a Substitute, covers main Question also, unless otherwise specified.
 - (7) At time fixed for vote to be taken, no motion shall be in order except to adjourn.
- d. To Amend or to Substitute
 - (1) All amendments to resolutions must be delivered to the Secretary of Convention in writing prior to the vote.
 - (2) Amendments and Substitutions are debatable only when main question is debatable.
 - (3) One Amendment may be made to each independent or separable portion of a Resolution; and the right to amend extends only to one Amendment of that Amendment and to a Substitute and one Amendment thereto.
 - (4) A Substitute and its Amendment may be laid on table, but cannot

- be otherwise voted on until the original matter is perfected.
- (5) May not be renewed.
- (6) Majority vote.
- (7) Amendments and Substitutes must be germane.
- (8) Amendments and Substitutes may be withdrawn by maker, with consent of his seconder, before decision is had thereon.
- (9) If Amendment and Substitute is laid on table the effect is the same as if it had not been offered.
- (10) Neither the Substitute nor its Amendment shall be voted on (except to lay on table) until the original matter is perfected, and when the Original Question and Substitute are both perfected, the vote comes first on the adoption of the Substitute, or the Substitute as amended.
- (11) When a Substitute is pending, the motion to postpone indefinitely shall not be in order; but unless otherwise therein provided, the motions 1)to postpone to a certain time, 2) to commit or to recommit, 3) to take a vote immediately or at a certain time, or 4) to extend limits of debate, shall cover both the Substitute and the main Question.
- (12) No action on an Amendment or Substitute changes the status of the original Question. The original Resolution, as so amended, then remains the Question before the House.

VI. MOTIONS WITHOUT ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

- 1. The following motions have no order of priority, but are subject to the following rules:
 - a. Appeal from Decision of Chair.
 - Must be made immediately after decision.
 Mover need not be recognized, but requires a second.
 - (2) Debatable for two minutes by each speaker, each speaking once.
 - (3) Not amendable.
 - (4) May be laid on table.
 - (5) Majority vote. A tie vote sustains Chair.
 - (6) Cannot be renewed.
 - b. To Take from Table.
 - (1) Mover must be recognized and requires a second.
 - (2) Not debatable.
 - (3) Not amendable.
 - (4) Cannot be laid on table.
 - (5) Majority vote.
 - (6) May be renewed after progress.
 - c. To Suspend the Rules of Take Up Business Out of Order
 - (1) Mover must be recognized and requires a second.
 - (2) Debatable: two minutes to each speaker.
 - (3) Not amendable.

- (4) Cannot be laid on table.
- (5) Two-thirds majority vote.
- (6) Cannot be reconsidered or renewed.

d. To Divide the Question

- (1) May be made without being recognized and even though another member has the floor. When the voting is by Orders, the request for division must be made by the entire Clerical or Lay representation from any delegation.
- (2) Not debatable.
- (3) Cannot be amended.
- (4) Cannot be laid on table.
- (5) Majority vote, if vote required.
- (6) Can be reconsidered.
- (7) If the Question under debate contains several distinct propositions, which are independent of each other, at the request of any member the same shall be divided and a separate vote shall be taken, but the motion to strike out and to insert shall be indivisible.
- (8) If the propositions relate to the same subject, and yet each part can stand alone, they may be divided only on a regular motion and vote.

VII. RECONSIDERATION

- Neither a Question once determined, nor any Question of like import, shall be drawn again into debate or presented for action again during the same convention, except upon the adoption of a motion to reconsider the action previously taken on such Question.
- 2. All motions to reconsider shall be made and seconded on the day the vote is taken on the matter sought to be reconsidered, or on the next succeeding day on which the Convention shall be in session.
- 3. The effect of a motion to reconsider, if carried, is to restore the matter reconsidered to its status immediately prior to the original vote upon it.

VIII. DECORUM AND DEBATE

- 1. When the President shall be in the Chair, no member shall address the Convention or make any motion until after recognition by the President except to make a parliamentary inquiry, a point of order, or motion not requiring recognition.
- 2. No member shall address the President while any other member has the floor; except to present a parliamentary inquiry, a point of order, or a question of privilege.
- 3. When any member is about to speak or to deliver any matter to the Convention, he shall, with due respect, address himself to the President, state his name and his Parish or Mission, and confine himself strictly to the point of debate.

- 4. All questions of order shall be decided by the President, without debate, but any member may appeal from such decision, a) On such appeal the vote shall be upon the Question, "Shall the decision of the Chair be sustained?"
- 5. While the President is putting any questions, the members shall continue in their seats and not hold any private discourse.
- 6. Every member present shall vote when a question is put, unless excused by the Diocesan Convention, and, on a vote by orders, the name of Presiding Officer shall be called last.

IX. RULES OF DEBATE

- 1. The Commission or Committee Chair or Mover of the Resolution shall have 5 minutes to speak with respect to a report or resolution, and 5 minutes to respond to questions of information or clarification.
- 2. The entire debate of a report or resolution thereafter shall be limited to 20 minutes.
- 3. Each speaker shall be limited to 2 minutes and no speaker shall speak more than once on the same question, except by leave of the Convention.
- 4. To the extent practicable the President shall recognize speakers of the opposite views in alternate succession.
- 5. In the event the time for debate has been used, the time may be extended for an additional 5 minutes by a two-thirds vote in order to perfect the resolution.

X. RULES OF ELECTION

- I. All nominations by the Nominating Committee to Diocesan Offices requiring Convention approval will be in the hands of delegates at or before the last Pre-Convention Meeting. Other nominations may be made and seconded on the floor of convention.
- 2. In order to facilitate elections taking a minimum of ballots, the election procedure shall be as follows:
 - a. Single Vacancy Election
 - (I) Upon the first ballot, the nominee receiving a majority of the votes cast will be elected.
 - (2) If the vacancy is not filled by a majority vote on the first ballot, those persons receiving votes on 25% or less of the ballots cast will be removed from the next ballot.
 - (3) On the second ballot, the nominee receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be elected.
 - (4) If the vacancy is not filled after the second ballot, the nominee receiving the largest number of votes on the third ballot will be elected.

b. Multiple Vacancy Election

- (I) Each voter may cast one or more votes, up to the number of vacancies in the particular election.
- (2) Each voter may only cast one vote for a particular nominee.
- (3) Upon the first ballot, nominees receiving a majority of the votes will be elected. For example, if there are 100 ballots, a nominee must receive 51votes to be elected.
- (4) If all vacancies are not filled by a majority vote on the first ballot, the nominees receiving 25% or less of the ballots cast will be removed from the second ballot. For example, if there are 100 ballots, any nominee receiving 25 or less ballots will be removed from the next ballot.
- (5) If all vacancies are not filled after the second ballot, the nominees receiving the greatest number of votes on the third ballot will be elected.

XI. RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions may be submitted by any delegate to Convention, must be approved by the vestry or mission board of the submitting delegate's congregation and seconded by a delegate of another congregation whose vestry or mission board has approved such resolution. Resolutions may also be submitted by the Diocesan Council, any committee or commission of the Diocese or any board established by the Canons. Resolutions are to be submitted to the Resolutions Commission sixty days before Convention and handled according to the procedures of the Resolutions Commission; however, a resolution which does not comply with the requirements of this rule may be considered by the convention on an affirmative vote of the majority of the members present.

XII. MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. Clergymen of the Episcopal Church not entitled to seats and candidates for Holy Order of the Diocese shall be admitted to the sitting of the Diocesan Convention and their names entered on the Journal on reporting themselves to the Secretary, but without the right to take part in the proceedings.
- 2. The report of all agencies shall be in writing and shall be entered in the minutes unless otherwise ordered.
- 3. No member shall absent himself from the sessions of the Diocesan Convention unless he has leave or be unable to attend.
- 4. The above shall be the Rules of Order of all future Diocesan Conventions unless altered or rescinded.

THE CANONS OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN THE DIOCESE OF FLORIDA

CANON 1

Of Organization of Diocese and Convention

- SECTION 1. In General. The affairs of this Diocese will be managed by the Bishop of the Diocese, by the Standing Committee, by the Diocesan Council, and by such other officers and agencies as may be provided by these Canons so long as the same are consistent with the Constitution of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, the laws of the State of Florida and the Articles of Reincorporation of this Diocese. The provisions of these Canons shall be equally applicable to men and women and the use of one gender includes the other whenever the context so admits or implies.
- SECTION 2. Diocesan Convention. The Diocesan Convention is the legislative authority and chief policy making body for program and finance in the Diocese and shall be composed of the Bishop, Clergy canonically resident in the Diocese, and members representing each congregation of the Diocese. Congregations, who for two successive years, do not file the Annual Parochial Report by the deadline established by General Convention, or do not file the canonically required annual audit, shall have seat and voice, but not vote at the next Annual Meeting of the Diocesan Convention. Notification will be sent by March 30 to the Sr. Warden and Priest-in-Charge of any congregation not in compliance with this section. Appeals for exceptions must be made to the Bishop and Diocesan Council no later than November 30. Lack of notification will not release congregations from their responsibility.
 - (a) Annual Meeting. There shall be an annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention at such time and place as may be determined by the preceding annual meeting; but, for sufficient cause, the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese shall have power to change the time or place, or both; provided, however, that reasonable notice thereof shall be given to all clergy and congregations entitled to representation.
 - **Special Diocesan Convention.** The Diocesan Convention may be called to special meeting by the Ecclesiastical Authority at any time on reasonable written notice. The notice shall state the business to be considered by the Convention. No other business shall be considered except upon a three-fourths vote of the members in attendance at such meeting.
 - (c) <u>Quorum</u>. A quorum of any Diocesan Convention or any meeting thereof shall be one-half of the Clergy in good standing having cure in the

- Diocese, and one-half of the duly elected lay delegates, but a less number may adjourn from day-to-day.
- (d) <u>Pre-Convention Meetings</u>. Delegates to Diocesan Convention shall assemble in pre-convention meetings at such times and in such places as the Bishop may call upon reasonable notice to the Clergy and congregations of the Diocese to hear the budget, review proposed amendments to the Canons and take other actions to prepare for the Convention that the Bishop deems necessary (the "Pre-Convention Meeting").
- **SECTION 3.** Composition. The Diocesan Convention will be composed of the following who shall have seat, voice and vote unless otherwise prohibited by Section 2 of this canon:
 - (a) <u>Clergy Delegates</u>. All canonically resident clergy of the Diocese in good standing.
 - (b) <u>Congregational Lay Delegates.</u> Congregational lay delegates selected by each congregation on the basis of average Sunday attendance as reported in the last previous parochial report of a congregation according to the following formula: Average Sunday attendance of 1-150, two (2) delegates, with one additional delegate thereafter for each additional 150 (or fraction thereof) in average Sunday attendance.
 - (c) <u>Diocesan Council</u>. Every member of the Diocesan Council who is not otherwise a member of the Convention.
 - (d) <u>Standing Committee</u>. Every member of the Standing Committee who is not otherwise a member of the Convention.
 - (e) <u>Delegates-at-Large</u>. The Diocesan Council may, upon nomination by the Bishop, elect delegates-at-large from this Diocese.
 - (f) <u>Deputies to General Convention</u>. The year of the General Convention and the year following the General Convention every Deputy and Alternate Deputy to General Convention who is not otherwise a member of the Convention.

CANON 2

Of Attendance of Clergy and Lay Delegates

- **SECTION 1. <u>Duty of Clergy.</u>** It shall be the duty of every clergy delegate to the Diocesan Convention to attend every meeting thereof.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>List of Clergy Entitled to Seats</u>. At the opening of each meeting of the Diocesan Convention, a list of the clergy entitled to delegate seats therein shall be prepared by the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese and certified by the Secretary, and the number of those present shall be reported to the Convention, with absentees

noted.

- **SECTION 3.** Expenses of Clergy. The expense of clergy attending a meeting of the Diocesan Convention shall be paid by their respective congregations.
- **SECTION 4.** Selection of Lay Delegates. Lay delegates and alternates shall be selected at a meeting of each congregation not later than thirty (30) days after the close of the preceding annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention. Each delegate shall be selected for a term of two (2) years. The terms of delegates shall be so constituted that one-half shall be selected each year. Each congregation shall designate those selected for initial one year terms. Each delegate shall serve until a successor is duly selected.
- SECTION 5. Certification of Lay Delegates. The selection of lay delegates and alternates shall be certified according to the form herein provided, signed by the rector or priest-in-charge or one of the wardens or by the clerk or secretary of the selecting body which such delegates or alternates represent. Each such delegate or alternate shall be not less than sixteen (16) years of age and an adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the congregation with which he or she is affiliated and a regular attendant at public worship of this Church. The form of said certificate is as follows:

CANON 3

Signed _____

Of Elections by the Diocesan Convention, Vacancies

- **SECTION 1.** Elections. All deputies and alternates to the General Convention, all members at large of Diocesan Council and all members of the Standing Committee shall be elected by ballot. Unless otherwise provided in the rules adopted by the Diocesan Convention, all other elections by the Diocesan Convention shall be by ballot.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>Vacancies in Elected Agencies</u>. All agencies elected pursuant to Section 1 shall have the power to fill any vacancies within its membership between annual Diocesan Conventions.
- **SECTION 3.** Vacancies in appointments. If any person appointed to perform a duty dies or

removes from the Diocese or for any other cause cannot perform that person's duties, the Ecclesiastical Authority shall appoint a successor for as long as may be necessary, unless otherwise provided in the Canons.

SECTION 4. Nominating Committee. A Nominating Committee consisting of one person from each Region and including a mix of clergy and laity shall be appointed annually by the Bishop to serve during that year. The Bishop shall designate one member to be chair of the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall, before December 31 of each year, furnish, in writing, to the delegates to the annual Diocesan Convention a list of nominees to fill the offices of members at large to the Diocesan Council, members of the Standing Committee, Disciplinary Board, deputies to General Convention and of such other offices as may be requested of the Nominating Committee by the Bishop or Diocesan Council.

CANON 4

Of Regions and Regional Canons

SECTION 1. Regions. For the purposes provided in these Canons, the Diocese shall be divided into such regions ("Regions") with such territorial limits as shall be fixed from time to time by the Bishop with the advice and consent of the Diocesan Council.

SECTION 2. Purpose. The purposes of the Regions are:

- (a) To provide an effective flow of communication between the Bishop, Diocesan Council, committees and congregations; and
- **(b)** To assist member congregations in all possible ways to insure the maintenance of strong and effective congregations.

SECTION 3. Regional Canons.

- (a) For each region, a member of the clergy, canonically resident in this Diocese will be appointed by the Bishop to be the canon to the Region (the "Regional Canon"). The Regional Canon shall be the Bishop's representative to the region and at the Bishop's request shall assist the Bishop in providing pastoral ministry for clergy and their families and in fulfilling the Bishop's pastoral care and ecclesiastical responsibilities.
- (b) The Regional Canon will represent the Region on Diocesan Council.
- (c) The Diocesan Convention shall provide for compensation for the Regional Canon based upon the recommendation of the Bishop.
- (d) The Regional Canons will be accountable to the Bishop and Diocesan Council.

SECTION 4. Meetings.

(a) The Regional Canon may call any meeting of any persons within the

- Region for any purpose and at any time.
- (b) Pre-Convention Meetings may be held in combination of two or more Regions, as determined and called by the Bishop. In accordance with Canon 1, clergy and lay Convention delegates are participants in the Pre-Convention Meetings. Alternate delegates should attend these meetings whenever possible in order to be prepared for Convention.

CANON 5

Of the Secretary

SECTION 1. Election. The Secretary of the Diocese shall be nominated by the Ecclesiastical Authority, elected by the Diocesan Council and shall hold office at the pleasure of the Council.

SECTION 2. Duties.

- (a) The records of the Diocese shall be kept and maintained by the Secretary.
- (b) The Secretary shall serve as Secretary of the Diocesan Convention, shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Diocesan Convention in a minute book maintained for that purpose and such record shall be the official record of the proceedings when signed by the Secretary or Assistant Secretary, if any, and approved by the Bishop or other Presiding Officer.
- (c) The Secretary shall transmit to the secretaries of the General Convention a copy of the Journal.
- (d) The Secretary shall file such documents as may be sent to the Secretary and deliver them to the Historiographer to be preserved for the use of the Diocese.
- (e) The Secretary shall perform such other duties as prescribed by the Diocesan Council.
- (f) The Secretary shall have seat and voice but no vote in the Diocesan Convention and in the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Assistant Secretaries</u>. The Ecclesiastical Authority may nominate and the Diocesan Council elect additional Assistant Secretaries and prescribe their duties. These Assistant Secretaries shall also have seat and voice in the Diocesan Convention and in the Diocesan Council.

CANON 6

Of the Treasurer

SECTION 1. Election. The Treasurer of the Diocese shall be elected by the Diocesan Council and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Council.

SECTION 2. Duties.

- (a) The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all moneys collected under the authority of the Diocese and not otherwise regulated. The Treasurer shall forward, in due time, to the Treasurer of the General Convention the amount assessed upon the Diocese for the contingent expenses of General Convention.
- (b) Property. The Treasurer shall oversee custody of all deeds, mortgages, insurance policies, and other documents pertaining to the property of the Diocese, together with such additional duties with respect thereto as the Diocesan Council shall from time to time specify.
- (c) Requisition of Information. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to prepare a form of requisition for information pertaining to all property of the Diocese and of each congregation, parish, mission or agency thereof. The information called for in such requisition shall be full and complete for the purpose of maintaining an inventory of such property, of determining the fair market value therefore, and of determining its insurable value. The Treasurer's annual report to the Diocesan Council shall include information pertaining to all property owned.
- (d) The Diocesan Council shall specify the additional duties of the Treasurer.
- (e) The Treasurer shall have a seat and voice but no vote in the Diocesan Convention and in the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Audits and Reports.</u> The accounts of the Treasurer shall be audited not less frequently than once each year, as the Diocesan Council may direct. The Treasurer shall submit an annual report to the Diocesan Council, and, when approved by the Diocesan Council, it shall be submitted to the Diocesan Convention.
- **SECTION 5. Bond by the Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall be bonded in a sum and with security satisfactory to the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 6.** <u>Assistant Treasurer</u>. The Diocesan Council may elect an Assistant Treasurer and shall prescribe the duties for this office.

CANON 7

Of the Chancellor

- **SECTION 1.** Election. The Chancellor of the Diocese shall be elected by the Diocesan Council, upon nomination of the Bishop, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Council.
- **SECTION 2.** Qualifications. The Chancellor shall be a lay person learned in the law, duly admitted and licensed to practice law in the State of Florida. The Chancellor shall

be an adult confirmed communicant in good standing.

- **SECTION 3.** <u>Duties.</u> The Chancellor shall be the legal adviser of the Diocese and of each office, committee and agency thereof, and of the parishes thereof, except as otherwise in these Canons expressly provided, and an ex officio member of the Convention Committee on Charter and Canons. The Chancellor shall have such other duties as may be prescribed by the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 4.** Reports. The Chancellor may submit reports to the Diocesan Council which shall be transmitted by the Council to the Diocesan Convention. The Chancellor shall make such recommendations as may seem to the Chancellor to be in the best interest of the Diocese.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Seat and Voice in the Diocesan Convention</u>. The Chancellor shall have a seat and voice but no vote in the Diocesan Convention and in the Diocesan Council.
- SECTION 6. <u>Vice Chancellors</u>. The Bishop may appoint, with the advice and consent of the Chancellor, Vice Chancellors to assist the Chancellor in the performance of the Chancellor's duties in any area of the law or in the regions of the Diocese as the Chancellor may deem desirable or necessary. The Vice Chancellors shall be qualified in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of this Canon 7, but they shall have neither voice nor seat in Convention (unless otherwise elected thereto) and are dispensed from having to report to Convention.

CANON 8

Of the Historiographer

- **SECTION 1.** Election. The Historiographer of the Diocese shall be elected by the Diocesan Council, upon nomination of the Bishop, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Council. The Historiographer may enlist the assistance of others interested in assisting with these duties.
- **SECTION 2.** Qualifications. The Historiographer shall be a person familiar with archival procedures, experienced in historiography and an adult confirmed communicant in good standing.

SECTION 3. Duties.

(a) It shall be the duty of the Historiographer to receive from the Bishop or the Secretary the manuscript minutes of the proceedings of the Diocesan Convention; original reports; files; parish, congregation and mission histories and other records of defunct parishes; records of Episcopal consecrations; and all other documentary papers and articles, which may aid in preserving an accurate history of the Diocese.

- (b) The Historiographer shall provide for the safe and orderly keeping of the records entrusted to the Historiographer's care, subject to such rules and regulations as the Diocesan Council may establish.
- (c) The Historiographer may issue a proper certificate of any fact of record in his charge.
- (d) The Historiographer shall perform such other duties as prescribed by the Bishop or Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>History of the Diocese</u>. The Diocesan Council may provide for the preparation and publication of the history of the Diocese.

CANON 9

Of the Standing Committee

- **SECTION 1.** Establishment. The Standing Committee shall be a council of advice to the Bishop. If there is no Bishop, the Standing Committee shall be the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>Composition.</u> The Standing Committee shall be composed of three clerical and three lay persons elected by the Diocesan Convention for terms of three years. The Diocesan Convention, at each annual meeting, shall elect one member of the appropriate Order to fill each vacancy.
- **SECTION 3.** Officers. The Standing Committee shall elect from its membership a President and a Secretary. The President, who must be a priest, shall have a seat and voice but no vote in the Diocesan Council except that, if there is no Bishop and the Standing Committee is acting as the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese, the President will have a vote in the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Meetings.</u> The Standing Committee shall meet at least once each year. The president may call a special meeting whenever the president shall deem it necessary on reasonable notice. The Committee shall meet on the call of the Bishop, whenever the Bishop shall desire their advice, and they may meet on their own accord and agree to their own rules when they may be disposed to advise the Bishop.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Vacancies.</u> Any vacancy in the membership of the Standing Committee occurring between annual meetings of the Diocesan Convention shall be filled with a person of the appropriate Order nominated and elected by the Diocesan Council. Such persons shall serve until the next annual Convention. The Nominating Committee shall present nominees to the next annual Convention for election to fill any unexpired term.

SECTION 6. Report to Diocesan Convention. The Standing Committee shall report its proceedings to each annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention, except those proceedings held in the exercise of its function as a council of advice to the Bishop.

CANON 10

Of the Diocesan Council

section 1. Statement of Purpose. The Diocesan Council shall be an executive body representative of the Church in this Diocese with power and authority to implement and carry into effect the policies and programs adopted by the Diocesan Convention and to act for the Convention between meetings thereof. The Council shall have overall responsibility for the Diocesan program and finances, and it shall provide for the efficient management of the business of the Diocese. It shall be an agency to relieve the Bishop of the Diocese insofar as practicable from the necessity of the detailed management of the business affairs of the Diocese.

SECTION 2. Composition. The Diocesan Council shall be composed of:

- (a) the Bishop (seat, voice and vote on Diocesan Council),
- (b) the Regional Canons appointed by the Bishop (seat, voice and vote on Diocesan Council),
- (c) five lay members at-large elected by the Diocesan Convention (seat, voice and vote on Diocesan Council),
- (d) two clergy members-at-large elected by the Diocesan Convention (seat, voice and vote on Diocesan Council),
- (e) the Secretary of the Diocese (seat, voice, no vote on Diocesan Council),
- (f) the Treasurer of the Diocese (seat, voice, no vote on Diocesan Council),
- (g) the Chancellor of the Diocese (seat, voice, no vote on Diocesan Council) and
- (h) the President of the Standing Committee (seat, voice, no vote unless the Standing Committee is acting as the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese, then vote on Diocesan Council).

SECTION 3. Terms and Election of Members.

- (a) Each at-large member of the Diocesan Council shall be elected for a term of three years and shall serve until the member's successor is installed.
- (b) The Regional Canons shall serve as members of the Diocesan Council during their period of appointment as Regional Canons.
- (c) The Secretary of the Diocese, the Treasurer of the Diocese, the Chancellor of the Diocese and the President of the Standing Committee will serve as

- members of the Diocesan Council for the period of time they fill their respective positions.
- (d) For purposes of election, the lay members shall be slated by Region but elected by the entire Diocesan Convention. One at-large lay member shall be a member of a parish in each Region of the Diocese. Each at-large lay member shall be continuously throughout their term of office a member of a parish in the Region from which they were elected.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Limitation on Successive Terms</u>. A member-at-large shall not be elected a member of Diocesan Council for more than two consecutive terms.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Vacancies.</u> A vacancy in the membership of the Diocesan Council shall exist in case of the death, resignation, removal from the Diocese, or incapacity of a member. If the vacancy is with respect to a member elected at large by the Convention, the Diocesan Council shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired term thereof.
- **SECTION 6.** Meetings and Quorum. The Diocesan Council shall meet at the call of the Bishop or any six members thereof. The Council shall meet at least once each calendar quarter. One-half of the voting members of the Diocesan Council (excluding the Bishop) shall constitute a quorum.
- **SECTION 7.** Rules and Procedures. The Diocesan Council shall have the power and authority to prescribe its own procedural rules for the performance of its duties and for the carrying out of its functions. The procedural rules so adopted shall not be in conflict with the Constitution or Canons of the Diocese.
- **SECTION 8.** Officers. The Bishop shall be chair of the Diocesan Council. The Bishop will nominate and Diocesan Council elect a Vice-Chair from the lay members-at-large within thirty days after the Diocesan Convention. The Vice-Chair will preside at meetings of the Diocesan Council when the Bishop (Ecclesiastical Authority) is absent. The Diocesan Council shall have the authority to elect such other officers as are provided for in these Canons.
- **SECTION 9. Powers.** The Diocesan Council shall have the following powers:
 - (a) <u>Powers of the Diocesan Convention</u>. The Council shall have all the powers of the Diocesan Convention when the latter is not in session except the power to elect a Bishop, to amend the Articles of Reincorporation or the Canons or to adopt rules of Convention.
 - (b) Responsibility for Business Affairs of the Diocese. The Council shall have the responsibility for the business affairs of the Diocese and of each Board and Committee thereof, which responsibility shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

- (i) property management;
- (ii) supervision of investments and the determination of investment policies;
- (iii) preparation of Diocesan program and a budget for submission to the annual meetings of the Diocesan Convention;
- (iv) authorizing the expenditure of all funds;
- (v) the management of all Diocesan bank accounts, including, but not limited to, selecting banks of deposit, closing bank accounts, and designating those authorized to sign checks for the Diocese;
- (vi) the receipt of all funds of the Diocese. The Council shall promulgate regulations governing the handling and depositing of such funds and shall name the person or persons responsible therefore;
- (vii) ordering an annual audit of the affairs of the Diocese by an independent certified public accountant and whatever special audits of any Diocesan office or business the Council may deem appropriate.
- (c) <u>Electing and Nominating Body</u>. The Diocesan Council shall have the function as the nominating or electing body, as the case may be, for all Trustees and Directors and members of directly controlled Diocesan institutions. In case of the death, resignation, removal from the Diocese, or incapacity of any person elected under this subsection, the Council shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired term by election.
- **SECTION 10.** Reports. The Diocesan Council shall provide for reports to be made to it by the officers of the Diocese, and each board, committee or other agency of the Diocese, and shall require such reports not less frequently than once each calendar year.
- **SECTION 11.** Reports to Diocesan Convention. The Diocesan Council shall submit to the annual meeting of each Diocesan Convention a narrative report of the work done under its supervision during the preceding year with such exhibits and attachments as it shall determine to be appropriate. The Diocesan Council shall make recommendations to each such Diocesan Convention with respect to the administration of the affairs of the Diocese.
- **SECTION 12.** Salaries. The Diocesan Council shall fix the salaries of all persons employed by the Diocese, except those fixed by the Diocesan Convention.

SECTION 13. Committees of Diocesan Council.

- (a) <u>Establishment</u>. Committees may be established by Diocesan Council to perform specified functions.
- **(b)** Membership. The Bishop with the concurrence of the Diocesan Council

- shall appoint the chair of each committee and all committee members.
- **Purpose and Composition**. The purpose and composition of each committee shall be prescribed by the resolution establishing the committee.
- (d) <u>Common Ministry Budget Committee</u>. Diocesan Council will establish a Common Ministry Budget Committee to prepare for submission to Diocesan Convention a budget for the funding of Diocesan programs, with such directions as Diocesan Council may deem reasonable and proper.
- **SECTION 14.** <u>Boards.</u> Supervisory or regulatory boards may be created by Canon and shall be under the supervision of the Diocesan Council pursuant to this Canon.

CANON 11

Of Committees of the Diocese

- **SECTION 1.** Establishment. There are hereby established three committees of the Diocese of Florida: a Committee of Finance and Investment, a Committee of Congregational Development, and a Committee of the Camp and Conference Center. Such other committees may be established as the Diocesan Convention deems necessary.
 - (a) <u>Finance.</u> The Committee of Finance and Investment shall implement all policies relating to the financial affairs of the Diocese and shall have the powers provided in Canon 12.
 - (b) <u>Congregational Development</u>. The Committee of Congregational Development shall implement all policies relating to the establishment of new congregations and shall assist the Bishop in overseeing the maintenance and growth of all congregations of the Diocese.
 - (c) <u>Camp and Conference Center</u>. The Committee of the Camp and Conference Center shall establish and implement all policies regarding the establishment, financing, management and operation for the Diocese's Camp and Conference Center.
- SECTION 2. <u>Composition</u>. The Bishop shall appoint the chair and members of each committee with the concurrence of the Diocesan Council. Each committee shall be composed of not less than five members, one of whom shall be appointed secretary. The Bishop shall be the ex officio chair of each committee. The appointed chair, unless an elected member of Diocesan Council, shall be an ex officio member with voice but not vote. Each committee may organize itself as it sees fit.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Terms.</u> Each committee member shall be appointed for a term of up to three years and shall serve until a successor is appointed. The Bishop shall designate the length of the term of a committee member at the time of appointment. Such

- committee member may be appointed for two successive terms. Thereafter, one year shall expire before such person may be eligible for reappointment.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Meetings</u>. Each committee shall meet at the call of its chair or the Bishop at least four times each year.
- **SECTION 5.** Reports. Each committee shall report on its work to the Bishop upon the Bishop's call, annually to the Diocesan Convention and at such other times as may be required to the Diocesan Council.

CANON 12

Of Finance and Investment

- **SECTION 1.** <u>Management.</u> The Diocesan Council shall take charge of, manage, and control all lands, tenements, hereditaments, trusts, money and other things belonging to the Diocese, and authorize the execution of all documents as may be required for such purposes subject to the limitations of Section 3 (c) hereof.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>President and Directors.</u> The Bishop shall be the President of the Diocesan Corporation, and the Diocesan Council shall function as the Board of Directors of the Corporation.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Authority to Act.</u> The Bishop and the Committee of Finance and Investment, together with the Treasurer, shall be authorized to conduct such business matters as the Diocesan Council may deem advisable.
 - (a) <u>Secretary of the Committee of Finance and Investment</u>. The Committee of Finance and Investment shall appoint one of its number to be secretary thereof to keep a record of its meeting, to certify to the same, and to execute documents in behalf of the Diocese as provided in Canon 5.
 - (b) Power of Committee of Finance and Investment 4Over Property. The Committee of Finance and Investment is authorized to manage and invest Diocesan assets; dispose of or encumber any Diocesan property; to borrow such sums of money at such rates and upon such terms as may be deemed necessary or expedient in meeting the budget approved by the Diocesan Convention or as amended by the Diocesan Council; and to authorize the execution of such documents as may be required for such purpose.
 - (c) <u>Limitations on Borrowing Power</u>. The Committee of Finance and Investment is authorized to borrow money for the use of any parish or mission within the Diocese, and to execute mortgages or any other surety documents in connection therewith, only at the rates and terms and other conditions specified by the regulation of the Diocesan Council.

Provided:

- (i) That no money shall be borrowed for the use of any parish without the written consent of the constituted authorities of the parish;
- (ii) That the evidence of the indebtedness of the Diocese for money borrowed shall be its promissory note executed as provided in Section 5:
- (iii) That any parish shall have the right to appeal the decision of the Committee of Finance and Investment to the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Bishop's Compensation and Contingent Expenses.</u> The Diocesan Convention shall annually provide for the payment of the Bishop's compensation and contingent expenses. The Chair of the Committee of Finance and Investment in consultation with the Vice-Chair of the Diocesan Council shall annually review the Bishop's compensation and contingent expenses and make recommendations to the Budget Committee of the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 5.** Execution of Documents. All deeds, notes, mortgages, and conveyances of property of the Diocese shall be executed by the Bishop, or, if there be no Bishop or in the event of the disability of the Bishop, by the President of the Standing Committee and attested by the Secretary or an Assistant Secretary of the Diocese under the corporate seal of the Diocese.

In the event the Bishop is absent, any two (2) of the following people may execute deeds, notes, mortgages, and conveyances of property of the Diocese which have been approved by the Committee of Finance and Investment and the Bishop:

The Treasurer

The Chair of the Committee of Finance and Investment

The President of the Standing Committee

The Chancellor

In the event there is no bishop and the President of the Standing Committee is unavailable, any two (2) of the following people may execute deeds, notes, mortgages, and conveyances of property of the Diocese which have been approved by the Committee of Finance and Investment:

The Chair of the Committee of Finance and Investment

The Treasurer

The Chancellor

SECTION 6. Prohibition on Alienation. It shall not be lawful for any parish or the corporate officers or congregation thereof to encumber, sell, alienate, transfer, or convey any real property, the title to which is held by and for the use of the parish without the

written consent of the Committee of Finance and Investment in accordance with this Canon and any such purported encumbrance, sale, alienation, transfer or conveyance is void.

CANON 13

Of the Architectural Review Board

- **SECTION 1.** Statement of Purpose. Subject to the authority and regulations adopted by the Diocesan Council, the Architectural Review Board shall review, offer consultation, and approve all building projects within the Diocese, whether initial projects, capital alterations or additions.
- **SECTION 2.** Establishment. There is hereby established the Architectural Review Board of not less than six members to be appointed by the Bishop with the concurrence of the Diocesan Council.
- **SECTION 3.** Officers. The Bishop shall designate the chair of the Architectural Review Board and the chair may designate a secretary from the membership. The Bishop is the ex officio chair of the board.
- **SECTION 4.** Reports. The Architectural Review Board shall report to the Diocesan Council and through it to the annual Diocesan Convention.

CANON 14

Of the Diocesan School System and the Board of Regents

- SECTION 1. Statement of Purpose and Mission. The Board of Regents operates under the authority of the Bishop and shall serve, lead and support the schools of the Episcopal Diocese of Florida. In exercising its responsibility to the Diocesan School System, the Board of Regents' mission is to: 1) nurture the teaching of Christian values; 2) promote and strengthen church/school/diocesan relations and 3) promote and develop Episcopal schools.
- **SECTION 2.** Officers and Members. Upon recommendation from the Heads of Diocesan Episcopal Schools and Directors of Diocesan Episcopal Early Learning Programs, the Bishop shall designate a Director, Rising Director, Secretary and one or more Diocesan Representatives for the Board of Regents. The Bishop is the ex officio chair of the Board.

CANON 15

Of Commissions

- **SECTION 1.** Establishment. To fulfill the ecclesiastical responsibilities of the Bishop, the Bishop may establish commissions responsible to the Bishop for such matters as the Bishop may deem necessary.
- **SECTION 2.** Officers. The Bishop shall appoint the chair of each commission. Each chair may designate a secretary from the membership of the commission. The Bishop shall be the ex officio chair of each commission.
- **SECTION 3.** Reports. Each commission shall submit a report to the Bishop annually and through the Bishop to the Diocesan Convention.

CANON 16

Of the Commission on Ministry

There shall be a Commission on Ministry appointed by the Bishop, to be chaired by the Bishop or a person designated by the Bishop. The Commission shall exist to assist the Bishop in exercising ecclesiastical and pastoral responsibilities for the Ministry of the Church in the Diocese, and to fulfill the requirements of the Canons of The Episcopal Church in the United States of America regarding Commissions on Ministry.

CANON 17

Of the Convention Committee on Charter and Canons

A Convention Committee on Charter and Canons shall be appointed by the Bishop, at least one lay member of which shall be an attorney at law. Each member of said committee shall serve for a three-year term. It shall be a continuing committee to sit between sessions of the Diocesan Convention. The Chancellor shall serve ex officio as a member of said committee.

CANON 18

Of the Organization and Admission of Parishes

- **SECTION 1.** Notice to Bishop. Notice of the desire to organize a parish shall be given to the Bishop, or, if none, then to the President of the Standing Committee. Said notice shall be in writing and contain such information as may enable the Bishop or Standing Committee to judge the propriety of the proposed act, which notice shall be signed by the persons who desire to organize.
- **SECTION 2.** Approval. Approval by the Bishop or Standing Committee shall be essential for

organization and for the admission of the parish into union with the Diocesan Convention.

- **SECTION 3. Requirements.** For the organization of a parish, 100 adult confirmed communicants shall assemble at the specified time and place, due notice in the manner of typical communication of those gathering, a minimum of two weeks prior to the assembly, and adopt and sign the Articles of Association prescribed by the Diocese in Section 4 of this Canon; provided, however, that no such organization shall be had until a specified annual sum towards the support of the rector and the expenses of the parish and a reasonable provision for the support of the diocese and diocesan expenses shall be assured to the satisfaction of the Bishop and the Standing Committee.
- **SECTION 4.** Articles. The Articles of Association shall be as follows: We, whose names are hereto subscribed, desirous of enjoying the privileges of religious worship and instruction for ourselves and families, according to the forms and doctrines of The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida, and desirous of being admitted to the benefits and privileges of the Diocese, being assembled in conformity to the Canons prescribed by the Diocesan Convention of said Church for the government of parishes composing same, under and by virtue of said acts, on this _ day of _____ Anno Domini, do form ourselves into a Parish and adopt the following Articles of Association, to-wit: This Parish shall be known by the name of "The Rector, Wardens, Article I. and Vestry of _____ at ____"

 - Article II. This Parish acknowledges, accedes to, and adopts, and shall at all times adhere to the doctrine, discipline, worship, rites and usages of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, and likewise the Constitution and Canons of said Church, as set forth by the General Convention, and the Charter and Canons of the Church in the Diocese of Florida, as prescribed by the Diocesan Convention.
 - Article III. When any person uniting with this Association shall disclaim, or refuse, conformity to the authorities mentioned in the preceding article, such person shall cease to be a member of this Parish.
 - Article IV. The Wardens and Vestry of shall be selected as provided in the Canons of the Diocese, and their duties shall be such as are conferred by said Canons.
 - Article V. Lay Delegates shall be selected to represent the Parish at the meetings of the Diocesan Convention as provided in the Canons of the Diocese, and it shall be their duty to attend all such meetings duly called.
 - Article VI. The title to all property, tenements, and other estates, real or personal, given to or purchased on behalf of the Parish or otherwise

acquired by the Parish, is and shall be vested in The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida, Inc.

- **SECTION 5.** <u>Application.</u> Any congregation complying with the provisions of this Canon may, upon application in writing accompanied by the Articles of Association or a certified copy thereof, be admitted into union with the Diocesan Convention.
- **SECTION 6.** <u>Termination</u>. Should any parish for the period of two years fail to comply with the conditions required for the organization of a parish as hereinabove provided, the Bishop, with the advice and consent of the Standing Committee, may, after due notice and hearing, terminate its Parish status.

CANON 19

Of Congregations and Vestry Meetings Selections and Duties

- **SECTION 1.** <u>Meetings.</u> There may be one or more meetings annually of each congregation on the call of the rector, priest-in-charge, or chaplain, or upon the call of a majority of members of the vestry, mission board, or advisory committee, due notice of which shall be given, to conduct such business as may be brought before it.
 - (a) Meeting After Each Annual Convention. There shall be a meeting of each congregation not later than thirty (30) days after the close of each annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention for the purpose of acquainting the congregation with the work of the preceding annual meeting and to select delegates to the next meeting of the Convention, and to conduct such other business as may be brought before it.
 - (b) <u>Presiding Officer</u>. At congregational meetings, the rector, priest-in-charge, or chaplain shall preside, or in the absence or at the discretion of such member of the clergy, the senior or junior warden in order shall preside. The secretary of the vestry or mission board shall be the secretary of the congregational meeting.
- **SECTION 2.** Qualifications of Voters. Persons qualified to vote at a congregational meeting shall be as follows, and the qualifications of any voter shall be determined by the presiding officer:

All adult communicants of the parish, mission or chapel who regularly attend services and business sessions of the congregation and are recognized as members of the congregation, and who contribute by subscription or otherwise for the funds or expenses of the congregation and have done so for six months previous to the meeting, and who, if required, declare themselves conscientiously attached to the doctrine, discipline and worship of the Church.

- **SECTION 3.** <u>Vestries</u>. In every parish there shall be a vestry composed of not less than five members, to continue in office for the term selected by the congregation and until their successors take office.
 - (a) <u>Selection</u>. The selection shall be by ballot or by lot, as determined by the congregation.
 - (b) <u>Qualifications</u>. Members of the vestry shall be adult confirmed communicants in good standing of the parish for a period of six months last past at the date of their selection.
 - (c) <u>Number</u>. The number of members of the vestry and their terms of office may be set by resolution at any annual congregation meeting.
 - (d) <u>Vacancies.</u> Vacancies will be filled in accordance with the written bylaws, policies, or procedures approved by the parish in accordance with Canon 19, Section 7. The selection of a communicant to an unexpired term shall not disqualify that person as a candidate for selection at the next annual meeting.
- **SECTION 4.** <u>Duties of Vestry.</u> It shall be the duty of the vestry to take charge of the temporal concerns of the parish and to work with the clergy and laity of the congregation for the furtherance of the Church's purpose. It shall execute all duties imposed by any General Convention, the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church, any convention of the Diocese and these Canons.
 - (a) Officers. The rector shall be chair of the vestry. The rector shall appoint a member of the vestry senior warden and the vestry shall elect one of their number junior warden. The vestry shall elect a secretary and treasurer and such other officers as they may deem necessary.
 - (b) <u>Senior Warden</u>. The senior warden (or in the absence of the senior warden, the junior warden) shall with the vestry provide for the decent celebration of public worship. In the absence of the rector, the senior warden shall call meetings of the vestry and preside over the same and be in charge of the congregation's discretionary fund.
 - (c) <u>Meetings</u>. There shall be at least one meeting of the vestry in each quarter of the year; however, the rector, senior warden or junior warden shall call a meeting at any time upon the request of one-third of the members of the vestry. The rector and all members of the vestry shall be given due notice of all meetings of the vestry.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Vacancy in Office of Rector</u>. When a parish or congregation becomes vacant of clergy, the Church wardens or other proper officers shall notify the Bishop. If the authorities of the parish shall for thirty days have failed to make provision for the services, it shall be the duty of the Bishop to take such measures as the Bishop may deem expedient for the temporary maintenance of divine services therein.

- **SECTION 6.** Election of Clergy. The vestry shall elect (subject to the approval of the Bishop) a rector. Upon the nomination of the rector, it may elect (subject to the approval of the Bishop), assistant clergy.
- **SECTION 7.** Written By-laws, Policies or Procedures. Every parish shall adopt by a majority vote of qualified voters present at a duly called congregational meeting written by-laws, policies, or procedures consistent with these Canons, the Constitution of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, the laws of the State of Florida and the Articles of Reincorporation of this Diocese.

CANON 20

Of Organized Missions

- SECTION 1. Categories of Congregations. The Diocese recognizes two kinds of congregations: missions and parishes. Parishes are described in Canons 18 and 19. A mission is a congregation that, due to size of membership, income and defined mission to its area, is either dependent upon the Diocesan budget for support of priestly ministry or is sharing or otherwise providing for limited priestly ministry with or without cost of the diocesan budget.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>Mission Congregations.</u> The requirements for the organization of a mission congregation shall be established by the Bishop with the advice of the Committee of Congregational Development. Approval by the Bishop shall be essential for the organization and for the admission of a mission into union with the Diocesan Convention.
 - (a) Every application to organize a new mission shall be accompanied by a certificate showing the approval or disapproval of the applicant's Regional Canon and the existing congregations in the general area to be served by the mission.
 - (b) The following application must be adopted and signed by the persons eighteen years of age or over who propose to be members of the mission:

Reverend Father in God: We, the undersigned residents of
, County of being
desirous of obtaining the services of the Episcopal Church, and
ready according to our several abilities to sustain the same, do
hereby request you to inquire into our estate, and provide for us as
you may deem proper and expedient.

We do hereby declare ourselves, individually and collectively, ready to establish and sustain the regular worship of the said Church and promote its influence in our neighborhood; and we

promise conformity to its doctrine, discipline, liturgy, rites, and usages. We put ourselves under your charge and will reverently obey your authority. We promise conformity to the Constitution and Canons of the General Convention and of the Diocese of Florida, and to the rules and regulations of its Diocesan Convention. In accordance with these obligations and rules, we now ask the privilege of being organized as a Mission under the name of

Article II. We hereby specifically stipulate and agree to raise among us, and faithfully disburse in accordance with the rules of the Diocesan Council every year, such contribution as may be assumed by us as our minimum toward the stated salary of the priest-in-charge who may be sent to us, and a sum towards the support of the Diocese and Diocesan expenses and we now agree for the first year to _____ annually in monthly installments. Remaining obediently yours in the Church of God."

- (c) If the Bishop consents to the organization of a mission, the Bishop may appoint a priest-in-charge to have charge of the mission. The Bishop shall also appoint, on consultation with the priest-in-charge, the following officers for the first year and each year thereafter to wit: two wardens, a secretary, and a treasurer. Such officers and others appointed to the Mission Board shall constitute a mission board whose rights and duties shall be defined by the Bishop. The number may be increased by the Bishop as the need of the mission may require.
- (d) The title to all property, tenements, and other estates, real or personal, given to or purchased on behalf of the mission or otherwise acquired by the Mission, shall be vested in The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida, Inc.
- (e) The failure of the members of an organized mission to fulfill their obligations under this canon shall warrant the Bishop in changing the status of that congregation as deemed necessary by the Bishop.

CANON 21

Of the Clergy and Their Duties

SECTION 1. <u>Authorization to Officiate</u>. Before any member of the clergy may be allowed to officiate in any church or congregation in this Diocese, such person must first produce the letters of orders or other satisfactory evidence that such person is an authorized minister of the Church in good standing. Whenever there is a settled

rector or minister, such person shall be the sole judge in the premises, but if the parish is vacant, the wardens and vestry shall require the fulfillment of the above conditions, together with approval of the Ecclesiastical Authority.

- **SECTION 2.** To Record and to Report. Every minister of this Church in charge of a congregation shall keep a register of baptisms, confirmations, communicants, marriages and burials within the minister's cure, and report the same to the Bishop ten days before each annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention, stating the number of services held and official acts performed by or under the supervision of such minister from January 1st through December 31st.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Membership List.</u> Each rector of a parish and priest-in-charge in charge of a congregation shall send to the Bishop each year a list of the communicants or members, as required by the Bishop, or the parish or mission, with addresses.
- **SECTION 4.** Of the Conduct of Clergy. Clergy shall pattern their lives in accordance with the teaching of Christ so that they may be wholesome examples to their people, including, but not limited to, abstaining from sexual relations outside of Holy Matrimony.

CANON 22

Of Registers and Reports

- SECTION 1. Parish Registers. In every parish, the vestry shall provide a Parish register, in which the rector or priest-in-charge shall record the name of each person baptized with the date of birth, the name of the parents and sponsors, and date of baptism; and the names of all persons confirmed, married, or buried, with their respective dates. It shall be the duty of each officiating minister to sign the record of each entry. The said register shall also contain a list of all the baptized members and confirmed communicants in the parish. It shall be the responsibility of the Wardens to see that the record is maintained in accordance with these Canons. At each organized mission a like register shall be kept by the priest-in-charge or someone appointed by the Bishop.
- **SECTION 2.** Reports Required by General Convention. As soon as possible after the first day of January, the rector of each parish and priest-in-charge of each mission (or, in the case the parish is vacant, one of the wardens) shall make upon the proper form provided by the General Convention and furnished by the Secretary of the Diocese, a complete and accurate report to the Bishop and to Diocesan Convention. Such parochial report shall be sent to the office of the Secretary of the Diocese not later than March 1. Notification will be sent by March 30 to a Warden and the Priest-in-Charge of any congregation not in compliance with this section.

- **SECTION 3.** Failure to File. In case any parish or mission shall fail to send before the first day of March the report required by this section to the Bishop, the Bishop may send a certified accountant to said parish or mission, who shall have access to the books of said parish or mission, and who shall, at the expense of said parish or mission, make up said report and forward same to the proper person for the carrying out of the provisions of this section.
- **SECTION 4.** Reports. A report shall be promptly made to the Ecclesiastical Authority of the selection or appointment of all lay convention delegates, vestries and mission Boards, giving their names, addresses, and terms office.

CANON 23 Of Lay Readers

Before any person shall officiate as lay reader, such person shall comply with the requirements of the Canons of the General Convention.

CANON 24 Of College Centers, Chapels, and Chaplains

- SECTION 1. College Centers. At any institution of higher learning in the Diocese, it shall be lawful for the Church to establish college centers and for the Bishop to appoint chaplains thereof, such establishments to be made by vote of the Diocesan Convention acting upon the recommendations of the Diocesan Council. Chapels erected at such centers shall have the status of Chapels of the Diocese. The congregations of such chapels shall have representation in the Diocesan convention according to Canon 1 governing representation from congregations. Chaplains so appointed shall have the status of priest-in-charge and shall be subject to the same controls.
- SECTION 2. Advisory Committee. To the benefit of college centers and the care of the properties erected and used for their activities, the Bishop shall annually appoint an advisory committee for each center. Members of the committee shall be nominated by the chaplain and shall have the authority and responsibility under the direction of the Diocesan Council Division for administration and planning of the college center and the Church's life and mission to that particular college or university. It shall be the duty of such advisory committee to care for the properties of the center for which they are appointed; to inform the Diocesan Council of the Diocese from time to time of needed repairs and improvements; and to aid the Bishop or the chaplain in the disbursement of such funds and bequests as may be left to the center.

- **SECTION 3.** Salaries and Operating Expenses. The Diocesan Council, acting on the recommendation of the Bishop or the Ecclesiastical Authority, shall provide for the necessary operating expenses of such chaplains. Salaries of chaplains, together with premiums due thereon to the Church Pension Fund, shall be provided and fixed in like manner as the salaries and pension premiums of other priest-in-charge clergy.
- **SECTION 4.** Records. The chaplain of a college center shall keep a standard register in which shall be recorded all official acts performed at the chapel as provided in these Canons. It shall be the special duty of the chaplain to transfer all communicants enrolled upon the said register at the time of their permanent departure from the institution of learning involved.
- **SECTION 5.** <u>Annual Reports of Chaplains</u>. The chaplain shall make annual reports to the Ecclesiastical Authority as provided in these Canons.

CANON 25

Of the University of the South

- **SECTION 1.** <u>Institution of Diocese</u>. The University of the South is declared to be the institution of higher learning of the Diocese of Florida.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>Election of Trustees</u>. The Diocesan Council shall elect three trustees of the University of the South, consisting of one clerical and two lay trustees, whose terms of office shall be three years and until their successors are elected.
- **SECTION 3.** Reports by Trustees. The trustees shall annually report to the Diocesan Council and to the annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention.

CANON 26

Of the Judicial System of the Diocese

- **SECTION 1.** <u>Title IV of General Canons.</u> Those provisions of Title IV of the Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church (the "General Canons") that are applicable to the Diocese are hereby incorporated as part of this Canon. To the extent, if any, that any of the provisions of this Canon are in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of Title IV, the provisions of Title IV shall govern.
- **SECTION 2. Discipline Structure.**
 - (a) **Disciplinary Board. The Board shall consist of not less** than nine

- persons, five of whom are members of the Clergy and four of whom are Laity.
- (b) <u>Clergy Members</u>. The Clergy members of the Board must be canonically resident within the Diocese.
- (c) <u>Lay Members</u>. The lay members of the Board shall be adult communicants in good standing at an Episcopal parish or mission within the Diocese.
- (d) Election. Commencing with the One Hundred and Sixty Ninth Annual Convention of the Diocese of Florida, the members of the Board shall be elected by the Convention. Each member shall be elected for a three (3) year term. The term of the member shall commence on the first (1st) day of the month following election. The terms of office of the Board shall be staggered and arranged into three classes. All persons elected under this section are eligible to be re-elected upon the expiration of their terms. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no persons elected under this section are eligible to be re-elected for more than two consecutive terms.
- (e) **Vacancies.** Vacancies on the Board shall be filled as follows:
 - (i) Upon the determination that a vacancy exists, the President of the Board shall notify the Bishop of the vacancy and request appointment of a replacement member of the same order as the member to be replaced.
 - (ii) The Bishop shall appoint a replacement Board member in consultation with the Standing Committee.
 - (iii) Persons appointed to fill vacancies on the Board shall meet the same eligibility requirements as apply to elected Board members.
 - (iv) With respect to a vacancy created for any reason other than pursuant to a challenge as provided below, the term of any person selected as a replacement Board member shall be until the next annual Convention. With respect to a vacancy resulting from a challenge, the replacement Board member shall serve only for the proceedings for which the elected Board member is not serving as a result of the challenge.
- (f) <u>Preserving Impartiality.</u> In any proceeding under this Canon, if any member of a Conference Panel or Hearing Panel of the Board shall become aware of a personal conflict of interest or undue bias, that member

shall immediately notify the President of the Board and request a replacement member of the Panel. Respondent's Counsel and the Church Attorney shall have the right to challenge any member of a Panel for conflict of interest or undue bias by motion to the Panel for disqualification of the challenged member. The members of the Panel not the subjects of the challenge shall promptly consider the motion and determine whether the challenged Panel member shall be disqualified from participating in that proceeding.

- (g) <u>President.</u> Within sixty (60) days following the effective date of this Canon and thereafter within sixty (60) days following each annual Convention, the Board shall convene to elect a President to serve for the following calendar year.
- (h) <u>Intake Officer</u>. The Intake Officer shall be appointed from time to time by the Bishop after consultation with the Board. The Bishop may appoint one or more Intake Officers according to the needs of the Diocese. The Bishop shall publish the name(s) and contact information of the Intake Officer(s) throughout the Diocese.
- (i) <u>Investigator</u>. The Bishop shall appoint an Investigator in consultation with the President of the Board. The Investigator may, but need not, be a member of the Episcopal Church.
- (j) <u>Church Attorney.</u> Commencing within sixty (60) days following the effective date of this Canon and thereafter within sixty (60) days following each annual Convention, the Bishop shall appoint an attorney to serve as Church Attorney to serve for the following calendar year. The person so selected must be a member of an Episcopal parish or mission within the Diocese and a member in good standing of the Florida Bar.
- (k) <u>Pastoral Response Coordinator</u>. The Bishop may appoint a Pastoral Response Coordinator, to serve at the will of the Bishop in coordinating the delivery of appropriate pastoral responses provided for in Title IV.8 of the General Canons and this Canon. The Pastoral Response Coordinator may be the Intake Officer, but shall not be a person serving in any other appointed or elected capacity under this Canon.
- (l) <u>Advisors</u>. In each proceeding under this Canon, the Bishop shall appoint an Advisor for the Complainant and an Advisor for the Respondent. Persons serving as Advisors shall hold no other appointed or elected position provided for under this Canon, and shall not include chancellors or vice chancellors of this Diocese or any person likely to be called as a witness in the proceeding.

(m) <u>Clerk.</u> The Board shall appoint a Board Clerk to assist the Board with records management and administrative support. The Clerk may be a member of the Board.

SECTION 3. Costs and Expenses.

- (a) <u>Costs Incurred by the Church</u>. The reasonable costs and expenses of the Board, the Intake Officer, the Investigator, the Church Attorney, the Board Clerk and the Pastoral Response Coordinator shall be the obligation of the Diocese, subject to budgetary constraints as may be established by Diocesan Council.
- (b) <u>Costs Incurred by the Respondent</u>. In the event of a final Order dismissing the complaint at the discretion of the Bishop, the reasonable defense fees and costs incurred by the Respondent may be paid or reimbursed by the Diocese, subject to budgetary constraints as may be established by Diocesan Council.

SECTION 4. Records.

- (a) <u>Records of Proceedings</u>. Records of active proceedings before the Board, including the period of any pending appeal, shall be preserved and maintained by the Diocesan offices.
- (b) **Permanent Records.** The Bishop shall make provision for the permanent storage of records of all proceedings under this Canon at the Diocese and the Archives of the Episcopal Church, as prescribed in Title IV of the General Canons.
- **SECTION 5. Effective Date.** The effective date of this Canon shall be July 1, 2011. Except as otherwise provided in this Canon, the predecessor to this Canon shall stand repealed on the effective date of this Canon. Matters which are pending under the predecessor to this Canon on the effective date shall proceed in the manner prescribed in the General Canons.

CANON 27

Of Deputies to General Convention and Provincial Synod

SECTION 1. Election of Deputies. The Diocesan Convention shall elect deputies and alternate deputies to General Convention at the regular meeting of the Diocesan Convention, which occurs in the year prior to the year in which the General Convention meets. Five clerical persons canonically resident in the Diocese and five lay persons who shall be adult confirmed communicants in good standing

shall be elected by majority ballot to represent this Diocese as deputies and alternate deputies in said Convention.

- (a) The four clerical and four lay persons receiving the highest number of votes in their respective orders shall be designated Clergy and Lay Deputies.
- (b) The clerical and lay persons receiving the fifth highest number of votes in their respective orders shall be the Clergy and Lay Alternates.
- (c) If a deputy is subsequently unable to serve, the alternate in the same order will move into the deputy position and the next highest vote recipient in that order shall be offered the alternate position.
- (d) The vote count for all deputy nominees shall be retained by the Secretary of Diocesan Convention in the event that an additional clergy or lay deputy will be needed due to the inability of a clergy or lay deputy to remain in office. The next highest vote recipient in the clergy or lay order shall move into the open position.
- (e) Deputy and alternate deputy terms are 3 years or until replaced at the next deputy election cycle of Diocesan Convention. Deputies and alternate deputies may be elected to successive terms. No one in the process for ordination, aspirant, postulate or candidate for Holy Orders shall be elected to represent this Diocese as a deputy in General Convention.
- (f) The Bishop shall appoint one chair of the deputation from the four elected clergy deputies or the four elected lay deputies.

SECTION 2. Certification of Deputies and Alternates.

- (a) Agreement by a candidate to have their name placed into nomination to become a General Convention deputy shall signify to the Bishop their acceptance of the election and intention to perform their duties in full, including attendance at Province IV Synods as well as General Convention. If a deputy or alternate is no longer able to fulfill their duties, notice shall be immediately given to the Bishop and the next alternate shall move up in accordance with Section 1(c) above. The persons so recognized by the Bishop shall have all the power of authority of the deputies duly elected by the Diocesan Convention.
- (b) The deputation chair shall fill out the Testimonial of Deputy Selection and the Alternate Deputy Selection Form and any necessary amendments provided by the General Convention Office. Such forms shall be signed and submitted to the General Convention Office by the Secretary of Diocesan Convention in a timely manner.
- (c) In case of a vacancy in the Episcopate or the inability of the Bishop to act, this power of designation shall be exercised by the Standing Committee.
- **SECTION 3.** <u>Vacancy During Convention</u>. If at the meeting of the General Convention any deputy elected by Convention or designated by the Bishop or Standing Committee

shall fail to attend or, after being seated, shall obtain leave of absence for the remainder of the session, such vacancy shall be filled by the next alternate among Clerical or Lay orders who may be in attendance of said General Convention.

- SECTION 4. Expenses. The Diocesan Convention will provide for the payment by the Diocese of the reasonable travel, registration, per diem, housing and other authorized expenses of clerical and lay deputies and the clerical and lay alternate in each order (total of five in each order) to attend the General Convention. The Diocesan Convention will also provide for payment by the Diocese of the reasonable registration, meals and housing and other authorized expenses (but not travel) of clerical and lay deputies and the clergy and lay alternate in each order (total of five in each order) for attendance at Province IV Synods the year preceding and the year of the meeting of the General Convention.
- **SECTION 5. Provincial Synod.** During the year preceding and the year of the meeting of the General Convention, the clerical and lay deputies to General Convention and the alternate in each order shall be deputies to the Province IV Synod. In the case that additional Province IV Synods are conducted, the current deputies and alternate deputies will attend at Diocesan expense with the approval of the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese, in accordance with Section 4 above.
- **SECTION 6.** Report to Diocesan Convention. The Deputation Chair will prepare a report to Diocesan Convention regarding General Convention. The report will be for the next Diocesan Convention immediately following General Convention and will be in writing, no more than two pages in length.

CANON 28

Of the Church Pension Fund

- **SECTION 1.** Performance. There shall be contributed to the Church Pension Fund by each parish and mission in the Diocese and by the Diocese, respectively, a sum equal to the percentage of the annual salary to be reckoned according to the rules prescribed by the General Canons and the other proper authority for the administration of the Church Pension Fund.
- **SECTION 2.** <u>Assistance</u>. The Bishop of the Diocese may appoint a committee of five laymen whose duty it shall be to cooperate with the proper authority of the said Church Pension Fund to make effective the plan thereof as established by the General Convention.

CANON 29

Of Rules and Procedure

The Convention and all Diocesan agencies may adopt such rules of procedure as are not inconsistent with the Articles of Reincorporation, these Canons, or those as set forth by the General Convention; and in all matters of procedure not otherwise provided for, Robert's Rules of Order as revised shall be followed.

CANON 30

Of a Quorum

In all cases in which a Canon directs a duty to be performed or a power to be exercised by any agency of the Diocese, a majority of the members, the whole being duly cited to meet, shall be a quorum, and a majority of the quorum so convened shall be competent to act, unless the contrary be expressly prescribed by Canon or some existing Charter, Constitution, or Law.

CANON 31

Of Alterations

- **SECTION 1.** <u>In General</u>. No proposed alteration of, or addition to, these Canons shall be considered by the Diocesan Convention unless:
 - (a) such alteration or addition shall have been referred to, and a recommendation made to the Convention by, the Convention Committee on Charter and Canons; or
 - (b) by unanimous consent of the Convention.

Such alterations or additions to the Canons may be adopted by a two-thirds vote of the same Convention.

SECTION 2. Additions. Additions to these Canons shall be numbered to precede this Canon.

CANON 32

Of Repealing Canon

Except as expressly provided herein, all former Canons of the Diocese of Florida not included in these Canons are hereby repealed.

THE ARTICLES OF REINCORPORATION OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN THE DIOCESE OF FLORIDA

ARTICLE I.

Name

The name of this corporation shall be:

"The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Florida, Inc."

ARTICLE II.

Purposes

The general nature of the objects and purposes of this corporation shall be:

- (a) To propagate and disseminate the Gospel of the Lord, Jesus Christ.
- (b) To be a constituent governing part of the "Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America" and, subject only to any limitations in the laws of Florida, the corporation recognizes, accedes to and adopts the Constitution of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, and acknowledges its authority accordingly.
- (c) To do all things necessary and proper in the pursuit of such objects and purposes.

ARTICLE III.

Location

The office of the corporation shall be in the City of Jacksonville, County of Duval, State of Florida, or such other place as may be designated from time to time by the Annual Diocesan Convention. Under the Constitution of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America, and until further action by such national body, the jurisdiction of the corporation comprises all that part of the State of Florida lying North of the Southerly boundary of the Counties of Levy, Alachua, Putnam, and Flagler, and East of the Easterly boundary of the Counties of Jackson, Calhoun and Gulf (that is, along the Appalachicola River, including that portion of Franklin County lying East of said River) as they exist in the year 1972.

ARTICLE IV.

Qualification of Members

The membership of the corporation shall consist of all persons resident within the jurisdiction of the corporation who are members of the Episcopal Church as such membership may be defined from time to time by the Canons (Bylaws) of the corporation.

ARTICLE V.

Term of Existence

This corporation is to exist perpetually.

ARTICLE VI.

Subscribers

The names and residences of the subscribers to the Articles are:

Secretary of the Diocese The Reverend Johnson Hagood Pace, Junior 7973 Denham Road, East, Jacksonville, Florida

ARTICLE VII.

Organization

- The affairs of the corporation are to be managed by the Bishop of the Diocese (who shall be President and Chief Executive Officer), a Standing Committee, the Diocesan Council (which shall consist of not less than three (3) members, and such other Officers and Agencies as may be provided from time to time by the Canons (bylaws). The Canons shall provide for the time and manner in which the Standing Committee, the Diocesan Council and other Officers and Agencies are elected and appointed.
- Section 2. The Bishop shall be the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese. When there is no Bishop, the Standing Committee shall be the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese for all proper purposes.
- Section 3. (a) The Diocesan Convention shall be the Legislative Authority of the Diocese. It shall be composed of Clergy and Lay Delegates as provided by the Canons. There shall be an annual meeting of the Diocesan Convention at such time and place as the Canons shall provide. The Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese shall have the power to call a special Diocesan Convention, provided that thirty (30) days notice thereof shall be given to all Clergy and Congregations entitled to representation, in writing, specifying the time and place of meeting and the business to be transacted.
 - (b) Each member, Clerical and Lay, of the Diocesan Convention shall be entitled

to one vote; unless a vote by orders shall be called for by three Clerical members or by the Lay delegation from one Congregation. If a vote by orders shall be called for, the Clergy and Laity shall vote separately, and a concurrence of both orders on the same ballot shall be necessary to constitute a decision.

Section 4. The election of a Bishop of the Diocese shall be had in Regular or Special Diocesan Convention. The quorum required for the election of a Bishop shall be two-thirds of all Clergy entitled to vote and two-thirds of all Lay Delegates entitled to be members of the Diocesan Convention. The election shall be in the following manner: After nominations have been made in open Convention, the vote shall be by orders (Clergy and Lay) and by secret ballot, and a qualified Bishop or Presbyter shall be chosen. A concurrent majority in both orders shall be necessary for a choice.

ARTICLE VIII.

Interim Organization

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by the Bishop and the following Officers and Bodies who shall serve until the next Annual Diocesan Convention and until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

(Names deleted - Refer to original copy in Diocesan Office).

ARTICLE IX.

Canons (Bylaws)

- Section 1. The Diocesan Convention shall provide such Canons for the conduct of the business and the carrying out of the purposes of the corporation as it may deem necessary from time to time, consistent with the Constitution and Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States of America and the laws of the State of Florida.
- Section 2. Such Canons shall be subject to amendment from time to time by the Diocesan Convention in such manner as may be provided therein.

ARTICLE X.

Amendments

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended by a resolution introduced in writing and considered in any Annual Diocesan Convention. If approved by a majority of the Diocesan Convention, it shall lie over until the next Annual Diocesan Convention when, upon consideration again, if it be approved in a vote by Orders, the amendment shall become effective.

ARTICLE XI.

Non-Profit Status

- **Section 1.** No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any individual or member.
- **Section 2.** No person, firm or corporation shall ever receive any dividends or profits from the undertakings of this corporation.
- **Section 3.** The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise act to influence legislation.

ARTICLE XII.

Powers

In order to promote the purposes of this corporation, it may acquire property by grant, gift, purchase, devise or bequest, and hold and dispose of such property as the corporation shall require for the benefit of the members and not for pecuniary profit.

Diocesan Council April 6, 2019 Meeting Minutes (Amended)

Those present: Rt. Rev. John Howard, Rt. Rev. Dorsey Henderson, Cn. Allison DeFoor, Cn. Wiley Ammons, Cn. John Wesley, Rev. Ronnie Willerer, Rev. George Hinchliffe, Mr. Ben Hill, Mr. Jack Tull, Mr. Jim Salter, Ms. Courtney Carter, Mr. Byron Greene and Hank Wilson, Esq.

The regular stated meeting of the Diocesan Council was called to order at 10:00 a.m. at the Diocesan House in Jacksonville, Florida with a quorum of members present. Bishop Howard opened the meeting in prayer and called on The Rev. Ronnie Willerer for the devotion.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read and carried. Bishop Howard reported that this was the first council meeting since convention in January, noting that a vice president for council needed to be voted on. Bishop Howard asked Mr. Jack Tull to continue in this role, which was unanimously passed and carried.

Bishop Howard then gave his report which included various changes at the next diocesan convention, namely more fellowship, by beginning with Friday night dinner for those interested. Attendance not required, but invited. He then gave a summary of his recent and various activities, including: Ecumenical Meeting (f/k/a LARC); Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's recent visit and highlighted visits while here, most notably confirmations at Wakulla Correctional Institution; Communion Partner Bishops meeting at Camp Weed (English and Canadian), in which there was further discussion on the issue of gay marriage; Bishop's Institute event on the Theology of Andy Griffith; Diocesan Capital Campaign, in which over \$13M had already been raised; meeting with Regional Canons; new rector at Trinity, St. Augustine, Matt Marino; University of North Florida's new chaplain, Sarah Locke (ECLA), who will also assist at Church of the Redeemer; House of Bishops meeting; Grace Mission, Tallahassee Gala/service/board meeting; and finally, advised that Allison Vining would be leaving Camp Weed as Summer Camp Director to return to the YMCA for advancement in her vocation. Bishop Howard asked for prayers for Mtr. Celeste Tisdelle, who has had a recent recurrence of leukemia.

Vice Chair, Jack Tull, then made inquiries over convention, as to whether there would be ministry tables, and whether ministry reports were to be given. Bishop Howard confirmed there would be ministry tables, and that he wanted to be especially conscious of time during convention, but that the request for reading reports was worthy of discussion.

Treasurer, Ben Hill, then gave his report. Ben noted that he would like to make up the \$38,500 in unpaid pledges from last year (generally written off). We have \$43k in pledges so far this year, although not paid. Per Rev. George Hinchliffe, 16 churches have not paid anything (including Bethany, Christ Church, Monticello and Welaka). Ben reported that our expenses are now under control with more accountability and no spending without prior approval. It was discussed and decided that Ben would send out "reminders" once a year to vestries over pledge due dates. Along these lines, Ben relayed that Mr. Jorge Maysonet,

Controller, suggested a Peer Review Committee to meet with these delinquent churches to listen and help, to assist, coach and guide. The committee would consist of 2 priests, 2 senior wardens and 2 treasurers. Rev. George Hinchliffe gave the names of 8 volunteers for this committee:

This was motioned by Ben Hill, seconded and carried. Bishop Howard asked that a Resolution to be drawn endorsing this proposal. Council unanimously agreed that this was a great goodwill effort. Cn. Wiley Ammons proposed his draft version of the Resolution, Ms. Courtney Carter made a motion to approve Cn. Ammons' Resolution, it was unanimously passed and carried (copy attached).

Next, Ben Hill reported that lease payments to the Diocese were slightly behind, conversely, the loans are looking good; Programs & Ministries were \$8,400 behind, but all expenses were under budget. Mr. Jim Salter questioned whether we should adopt a deficit budget. Cns. Ammons & DeFoor advised that this would most likely come to pass. Ben then proposed putting the quarterly budget reports on the diocesan website in full transparency. Cn. Allison DeFoor spoke up and advised the need to break the co-dependent relationships between the Diocese and parishes. The churches need adult, healthy relationships through empowerment. Ben recommended that the audit reports be presented by the Audit Committee in the future. Ben advised that the Camp and Conference Center accounting was moving back in-house vs. independent. Ben ended by advising that we would work on pledge support and relationships.

Cn. DeFoor reported that Christ Church, Ponte Vedra had closed San Pablo due to some money issues. He reported that we are looking at a lot of different options, possibly as a secular school.

Mr. Jack Tull reported on many of the Diocesan Council Ministry Group reports:

Architectural Board: Most of the Carpenter Gothic churches are in our diocese. In 1997, all Carpenter Gothic churches became a part of the Historical National Register. The diocese will need funds to support, protect and preserve these churches.

Charters & Canons: Jack Tull and Ms. Jill Dame, Chair, will have a conversation regarding the submission of canons and changes.

Historiographer: Ms. Beth Horne has asked to be taken off of this volunteer position. Bishop Howard is soliciting for suggested names at this time.

Cerveny Camp & Conference Center (CCC): Bishop Howard clarified that this commission is strictly an advisory board and not involved with any management. As we will soon have the CCC in-house, we will have a monetary report from them. The

Bishop noted that we need to push more Episcopal usage of CCC. New Director, Thomas Frazer, was commended for his great improvements with relationships.

Cursillo: Last weekend a Cursillo was held at CCC and it was reported that the CCC staff was excellent.

Evangelism: This committee will begin meeting monthly and working on a joint plan to grow our diocese by 4 churches in the Arlington area. Allison also reported on the following preaching stations in process and underway:

- Red Hills Congregation, Tallahassee
- Gateway Rehabiltation
- Jasper, Hamilton County, "St. Bernard's in the Pines"
- Wildlight, Yulee

Congregational Development Committee: It was decided to delete this separate committee and just leave "Evangelism & Growth". Cn. John Wesley then commended on evangelism at his new parish, St. Paul's, Federal Point. He reported on their recent ceremonial designation of Stanton Landing, at which over 200 people were in attendance, and making the front page of the newspaper.

Colleges, Schools & Young Adults: Mr. Byron Greene reported that St. Michael & All Angels is supporting the FAMU College Ministry Program through the Brooks Society. A handout of the impressive power point presentation was circulated to the council. This remains a work in progress but is coming together nicely. Byron will keep council updated.

Byron also recommended crafting a standardized report for all of the council group ministry reports. This was a popular suggestion and Byron and Jack will craft such form.

Ms. Courtney Carter suggested highlighting one of the ministries each month on the diocesan website. Jack will follow through with Emily Stimler, Communications Director, to create a link to each of the diocesan ministry reports.

Finally, Ben suggested sending out a form letter to each of the diocesan boards and committees with 4-5 generalized questions to determine whether the board or committee should remain in existence and update its membership.

The meeting concluded at 11:55 p.m.

Diocesan Council Meeting Minutes July 13, 2019

Those present: Rt. Rev. John Howard, Rt. Rev. Dorsey Henderson, Cn. Allison DeFoor, Cn. Wiley Ammons, Cn. Lance Horne, Cn. John Wesley, Cn. Jerry Smith, Cn. Bob Goolsby, Rev. Ronnie Willerer, Rev. Hugh Chapman, Mr. Jorge Maysonet, Mr. Jack Tull, Mr. Jim Salter and Mr. Byron Greene.

With a quorum of members in attendance the regular stated meeting of the Diocesan Council was called to order by the Bishop John Howard at Camp Weed, Live Oak, Florida, at 10 a.m. on Saturday, July 13, 2019. Bishop Howard opened in prayer and The Rev. Cn. Bob Goolsby provided the devotion. Bishop Howard led the Council in the Diocesan Prayer for Evangelism and Growth.

Bishop Howard reported that the funeral for Chris Keyser was well attended and that the service was properly done with Bishop Henderson being the celebrant. Bishop Keyser is very weak and limits visitors due to his failing condition.

The Rev. Aaron Smith is now the priest in charge at Grace in Orange Park. He will continue to be involved in the evangelism program.

We have four individuals currently attending seminaries and five in training to be vocational deacons. We were reminded that canon nine priests are limited to serving only at their assigned congregations.

The Bishop has been making visitations and attended an overnight prayer retreat at Camp Weed. He is looking forward to Earl Palmer's retreat at Camp Weed in September on the topic of Ephesians. Our next Diocesan Convention will return to Camp Weed and be held on January 25th in the one-day format as was done previously. Bishop Howard and Bishop Henderson are visiting prisons to conduct confirmations. The Bishop wants churches to support the P.O.S.T. meetings that are aimed at helping church staff members with their administrative duties.

The Rev. Cn. Allison DeFoor talked on the Budget Peer Review Committee meetings with churches that were failing to meet their 10% tithe to the Diocese. The meetings are not confrontational and are intended to help churches with problems prohibiting them from meeting their tithe. The Rev. Cn. Ammons asked if he could attend the meetings as regional canon and was told yes. The tithe problem continued with the discussion of the General Convention establishing the requirements for each Diocese to increase their contribution from 10% to 15%.

Mr. Jorge Maysonet provided the treasurer's report. Revenues for the first six months were \$506.000 on a budget of \$531,000 and expenses were \$628,000 on a budget of \$740,000.

Mr. Jack Tull and Mr. Byron Greene discussed the work being done on the reports' format for ministry reviews. A lot of work has gone into making the reports user friendly and useful for the Council. Ministry reports are due at the next meeting, October 19th, 2019.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m. with prayer led by Bishop Howard.

Diocesan Council Meeting Minutes September 14, 2019

A regular stated meeting of the Diocesan Council was held in the Ravine Conference Room at Camp Weed, Live Oak, Florida on Saturday, September 14, 2019. There being a quorum of members present the meeting was called to order by Bishop Howard at 10 am. The meeting opened with the Diocesan Prayer for Evangelism and Growth. Bishop Howard led the Council us in a devotion and reflection on Paul's letter to the church in Corinth. The theme was on the necessity to give generously from the heart, in other words our gifts have to come from a desire and willingness to give freely from what we have. Giving that is forced by intimidation misses the spiritual importance of commitment to Christ's work from the individual's heart. The Spirit leads with vision that will produce the resources to accomplish the vision. We lose sight of our mission to serve Jesus Christ when we become overly focused on the money and the return on investment.

The council was invited by the Bishop to reflect on Scripture in light of the issue of the increase from ten to fifteen percent in giving to the national church. A majority of the council voiced concern of the impact it would have on our churches that were already struggling financially. There was also concern over the national church penalizing those Dioceses that did not give fifteen percent thereby altering the tradition of freely giving from the heart. Some voiced concern that we should give the fifteen percent because we should support the decision of the national church. We decided that we needed to discuss further in an effort to reach consensus.

The minutes were approved as read.

The Bishop reported that the Diocese was spared from any major damage from hurricane Dorian. The Rev. Cn. Aaron Smith is now serving at Grace, in Orange Park. He will continue to serve the Diocese in the Evangelism effort. Bishop announced that the Rev. Cn. John Wesley and the Rev. Cn. Lance Horne had been relieved as regional canons and were made honorary canons for their service to the Diocese. Ms. Wanda Masters is the new historiographer of the Diocese replacing Mrs. Beth Horne.

Mr. Ben Hill provided the treasurer's report. As of August 31, 2019 our revenues were \$618,208 on a budget of \$632,532. Our expenses were \$702,947 on a budget of \$797,252. The support we received from the Foundation and Nehemiah funds were \$151,668 on a budget of \$251,417. We have \$76,509 in delinquent payments that are being pursued with the churches involved. The treasurer asked for clarification from the council on guidance to develop the budget based on ten or fifteen percent giving. The council voted seven to two to develop the budget on fifteen percent.

Mr. Jack Tull led the presentation of the 3rd Quarter Ministry Reports that were provided to the members. Mr. Byron Greene reported that his efforts to improve and streamline the ministry report format was making progress.

There being no further business to come before the council the meeting was adjourned at 1:15 pm in prayer led by Bishop Howard.

Diocesan Council Meeting Minutes December 7, 2019

A regular stated meeting of the Diocesan Council was held at the Diocesan House, Jacksonville, Florida on Saturday, December 7, 2019. There being a quorum of members present the meeting was called to order at 10am by Bishop Howard. Canon Allison DeFoor provided a reflection from the Book of Amos on staying focused during difficult times on the task to devote our hearts to the Lord by following his teachings.

Bishop Howard shared that Christopher Dell was ordained to the priesthood at the Episcopal School on December 4th and that Monica Bosque would be ordained on January 19, 2020. The Bishop commented that the clergy Advent party was well attended with over 140 in attendance and that it was a very enjoyable evening.

Canon DeFoor reported that we had some vacancies in the Diocese and that he was working on some potential individuals to fill those vacancies. The effort at Yulee is looking good. St. Peter's Fernandina has been a continuous help in this project.

Mr. Ben Hill provided the treasurer's summary. He reported that our 2019 revenue was very close to budget with an actual of \$2,059,253 to the budget of \$2,080,843. Our expenses were \$247,000 under our budget of \$2,611,877. He commented that our 2019 expenses were \$153,000 less than our expenses for this same period last year. The budget peer review committee will see if they can help the churches that are 90 or more days late in their pledges.

The Rev. George Hinchliffe presented the proposed common ministry budget for 2020. The budget reflected a \$764,636 reduction in support compared to the 2019 budget and a reduction of \$602,115 in expenses to the 2019 budget. These are major reductions that made the budget formulation a very difficult project. The council thanked The Rev. Hinchliffe and his committee for creating this very difficult budget. The Council unanimously approved the proposed 2020 budget.

Resolution 2020-001 for convention was presented. This resolution recommended a change to Canon 25 on the election of Trustees to the University of the South. This resolution failed by vote. Resolution 2020-002 for a Canon 3 amendment was tabled. Resolution 2020-003 that addressed the 15% asking will be presented at the Diocesan Convention and will become Resolution 2020-001. The Council unanimously approved the Housing Allowance Resolution for 2020 with the correction that The Rev. Beth Tjoflat housing allowance be changed to reflect \$50,000.

Mr. Jack Tull will send the ministry contact information changes to the chairpersons by email. This is the last council meeting for Mr. Tull. The Council thanked him for his dedicated service on the Council.

There being no further business to come before the Council the meeting was adjourned in prayer led by Bishop Howard at 12:25 pm.

CUBA COMPANIONSHIP MINISTRY THIRD QUARTER REPORT FOR 2019

Submitted by Chair Julia Sullivan, September 2019

Membership of the Diocesan Cuba Companionship Ministry (Dio CCM): More than 300 named "members," too many to list here. A "steering committee" of members assist Chair Julie Sullivan with ongoing organization and activity development: Rev. Dn. Phyllis Doty, Kathleen Whiting, Linda Wilcox, Claude Moulton (Co-Chair Jacksonville Area 22 churches), Marilyn Peterson (Co-Chair Gainesville Area 13 churches), and Julie Sullivan (Co-Chair Tallahassee Area 5 churches).

The Dio CCM spent much of this year 2019 adjusting to the impact of the 2018 REUNIFICATION of the Episcopal Church of Cuba (ECCuba) with TEC [see review of this historic event, attachment #1]. For example, TEC is now funding higher salaries for the priests in Cuba (\$150/month ~ vs. \$55/month last year). Therefore, the FL Dio CCM will now convert their annual campaign for Cuban priest salary boosters into joining and contributing to PB Michael Curry's capital campaign to fund a minimum base of \$800,000.00 for the Cuban Priest Pension Fund [see PB's campaign promo, attachment #2]. Floridians have been responding online to this national Pension campaign and by snail mail checks ... Thank you, Dio of FL ECW, who, at our request, gave \$1,000.00 to the Cuba Pension Fund in August 2019.

One of our other Diocesan projects did not turn out so well. The Cuba bus waiting for 2 years in Jacksonville to be shipped to Cuba had to be sold at a significant loss in June because of Cuban authorities' delays and vacillation on granting any import permissions.

The Dio CCM has also been implementing the transition plans of Bishop Griselda Delgado as the ECCuba is absorbed into Province II (New York, New Jersey, Europe) of TEC and where the business and canonical education of ECCuba will be conducted. However, Bishop Griselda confirms that the Diocese of Florida in its 35th year remains the home and heart of Companionship with Cuban Episcopalians. She asks that we stay the course in our walk with Christ and that we assist in welcoming and introducing the numerous new churches and dioceses throughout America to the idea and spirit of life-long Companionship with Cuban churches. Julie Sullivan will be traveling to Cuba together with a new group from Nantucket in November and Marilyn Peterson will be adding a Boston group with her mission trip to Cuba in December.

Julie Sullivan, Marilyn Peterson and Vickie Haskew with input from Bishop Griselda have been updating the church-to-church companionship pairings and updating contacts and email info for everybody. Moreover, our Dio CCM is now coordinating well with the nationwide strategy for Cuba, "Ichthus," developed by Jeremy and Pat Cage, St. Luke's-Darien CT, captured at resource website www.FriendsofECCuba.org and parented by the Cages and the international "Friends of the Episcopal Church of Cuba." Most of the volunteers of FL Dio CCM are inaugural, subscription members of this web-based Friends of ECCuba.

Holy Trinity-Gainesville has continued collaborating with St. John's-Lafayette Square DC and with the Rev. Gus Chrysson, VTS grad and now of St. Mary's-High Point NC, in leading the American-Cuban Music Ministry, now in its third year. The annual Music Festival normally takes place in November at the Cathedral Santísima Trinidad in Havana. This year, however, the Festival will be in Cardenas, Cuba, not Havana.

In June 2019 additional US governmental restrictions continued to be placed on Americans traveling to Cuba and vice-versa for Cubans to America. However, the traditional procedures of traveling with a religious visa obtained from Bishop Griselda's office are still honored and allow smooth passage into Cuba to fulfill our religious activities and mission projects. St. John's Cathedral and St. Mark's-Jax being the first to install water purification systems at St. Mary's in Itabo and at the Cathedral several

years ago, installation of this life and health saving project has been continued and expanded by St. John's-Tally and other frequent traveling companions from St. Luke's-Live Oak, Christ Church-Ponte Vedra, St. Francis in the Fields-Nocatee, St. Paul's by the Sea-Jax Beach, St. George's-Jax, Holy Comforter-Tallahassee, St. Alban's-Chiefland, Holy Trinity-Gainesville, and NEW COMPANION CHURCH = TRINITY PARISH-ST. AUGUSTINE, who will replace expired St. Michael's-Gainesville in companionship with San Juan Evangelista in Bacuranao, Cuba. Joined by other Episcopal churches from New York, Minnesota, Connecticut, Virginia, Wyoming via the Friends of ECCuba, some 25 of the 51 Episcopal churches/missions in Cuba now serve their own parishioners and their main-street communities with fresh, purified, potable water ... a welcomed and grateful first for thirst in most of these rural churches and communities.

The US no longer has an embassy, not even an interest office, in Cuba. The granting of visas to Cubans to visit the US has become extraordinarily difficult, even for Cuban clergy with US church sponsors. They must now travel to another country to interview for their \$160 US visas and unappealable denials are becoming the norm. Those clergy and family members traveling with them who were lucky enough to have received 5-year multiple entry visas or who hold Spanish passports (e.g., Bishop Griselda, some of her family members, Dean Jose Angel, Fr. Junco) can still visit with us here more frequently until visa expiration. Will Irby and Fr. Harold Ritchie were fortunate to welcome Deacon Adreano Fuentes and his wife Yuly of Santísima Trinidad-Morón to St. Alban's-Chiefland in August. But the US is no longer granting the 5-year visa versions, only one-time entry visas from here out ... a further curtailment to the crux of companionship ... the ability to develop relationships, friendships by breaking bread together.

Indeed, we feel the Holy Spirit moving us on to continue enthusiastically with our mission vision, to overcome the discomfitures we may experience along the way, and to rejoice in the evangelism and reciprocal love with our Cuban brothers and sisters in joyful service to our Lord Christ Jesus. We are so grateful to Bishop Howard for inviting Bishop Griselda to attend our Florida Convention on January 24 and 25, 2020. We eagerly look forward to having her join us at an annual Dio ECCuba meeting and dinner after the Convention. May the spiritual breezes from the land of the palm trees flow through us in Florida and spread their song of unity and healing to and throughout our sister states in the land of amber waves of grain with purple mountains' majesty.

The Episcopal Diocese of Florida Office of the Bishop Report of the Eighth Bishop of Florida

To the one hundred and seventy seventh annual Convention of The Episcopal Diocese of Florida held by ZOOM from Jacksonville, Florida on January 25th in the year of our Lord two thousand and twenty, and in the seventeenth year of my Episcopate.

In accordance with the requirements of the Canons, I herewith submit a report of my official activities in 2019 as the eighth bishop of Florida.

I have overseen tremendous spiritual growth in the Diocese of Florida in our 63 congregations, missions and preaching stations this past year. Evangelism has been our main focus. We continue to grow new leaders and spread the Good News. Not only have we championed and expanded ministries for young people, we have also expanded ministries to the urban and rural poor as well as those men and women incarcerated in our many prisons and to their families throughout this Diocese.

During the year 2019, I made 20 annual Episcopal visits for confirmations. The Rt. Rev. Dorsey F. Henderson, Assisting Bishop, made 20 visits for a total of 40 visits. There were 220 reported confirmations, 83 reported receptions, 51 reported reaffirmations and 6 reported baptisms performed by a bishop during these visits.

On May 30, I ordained Christopher G. Dell as deacon at Christ Church in Ponte Vedra. On December 4, I ordained The Rev. Deacon Christopher Dell as priest at Episcopal School of Jacksonville and serves as Associate Chaplain for Spiritual Life and Service.

On September 10, the Standing Committee of the Diocese and I accepted the resignation and removal of The Rev. Deacon Roy Allen Lima.

CUBA COMPANIONSHIP MINISTRY THIRD QUARTER REPORT FOR 2019

Membership of the Diocesan Cuba Companionship Ministry (Dio CCM): More than 300 named "members," too many to list here. A "steering committee" of members assist Chair Julie Sullivan with ongoing organization and activity development: Rev. Dn. Phyllis Doty, Kathleen Whiting, Linda Wilcox, Claude Moulton (Co-Chair Jacksonville Area 22 churches), Marilyn Peterson (Co-Chair Gainesville Area 13 churches), and Julie Sullivan (Co-Chair Tallahassee Area 5 churches).

The Dio CCM spent much of this year 2019 adjusting to the impact of the 2018 REUNIFICATION of the Episcopal Church of Cuba (ECCuba) with TEC [see review of this historic event, attachment #1]. For example, TEC is now funding higher salaries for the priests in Cuba (\$150/month ~ vs. \$55/month last year). Therefore, the FL Dio CCM will now convert their annual campaign for Cuban priest salary boosters into joining and contributing to PB Michael Curry's capital campaign to fund a minimum base of \$800,000.00 for the Cuban Priest Pension Fund [see PB's campaign promo, attachment #2]. Floridians have been responding online to this national Pension campaign and by snail mail checks ... Thank you, Dio of FL ECW, who, at our request, gave \$1,000.00 to the Cuba Pension Fund in August 2019.

One of our other Diocesan projects did not turn out so well. The Cuba bus waiting for 2 years in Jacksonville to be shipped to Cuba had to be sold at a significant loss in June because of Cuban authorities' delays and vacillation on granting any import permissions.

The Dio CCM has also been implementing the transition plans of Bishop Griselda Delgado as the ECCuba is absorbed into Province II (New York, New Jersey, Europe) of TEC and where the business and canonical education of ECCuba will be conducted. However, Bishop Griselda confirms that the Diocese of Florida in its 35th year remains the home and heart of Companionship with Cuban Episcopalians. She asks that we stay the course in our walk with Christ and that we assist in welcoming and introducing the numerous new churches and dioceses throughout America to the idea and spirit of life-long Companionship with Cuban churches. Julie Sullivan will be traveling to Cuba together with a new group from Nantucket in November and Marilyn Peterson will be adding a Boston group with her mission trip to Cuba in December.

Julie Sullivan, Marilyn Peterson and Vickie Haskew with input from Bishop Griselda have been updating the church-to-church companionship pairings and updating contacts and email info for everybody. Moreover, our Dio CCM is now coordinating well with the nationwide strategy for Cuba, "Ichthus," developed by Jeremy and Pat Cage, St. Luke's-Darien CT, captured at resource website www.FriendsofECCuba.org and parented by the Cages and the international "Friends of the Episcopal Church of Cuba." Most of the volunteers of FL Dio CCM are inaugural, subscription members of this web-based Friends of ECCuba.

Holy Trinity-Gainesville has continued collaborating with St. John's-Lafayette Square DC and with the Rev. Gus Chrysson, VTS grad and now of St. Mary's-High Point NC, in leading the American-Cuban Music Ministry, now in its third year. The annual Music Festival normally takes place in November at the Cathedral Santísima Trinidad in Havana. This year, however, the Festival will be in Cardenas, Cuba, not Havana.

In June 2019 additional US governmental restrictions continued to be placed on Americans traveling to Cuba and vice-versa for Cubans to America. However, the traditional procedures of traveling with a religious visa obtained from Bishop Griselda's office are still honored and allow smooth passage into Cuba to fulfill our religious activities and mission projects. St. John's Cathedral and St. Mark's-Jax being the first to install water purification systems at St. Mary's in Itabo and at the Cathedral several

years ago, installation of this life and health saving project has been continued and expanded by St. John's-Tally and other frequent traveling companions from St. Luke's-Live Oak, Christ Church-Ponte Vedra, St. Francis in the Fields-Nocatee, St. Paul's by the Sea-Jax Beach, St. George's-Jax, Holy Comforter-Tallahassee, St. Alban's-Chiefland, Holy Trinity-Gainesville, and NEW COMPANION CHURCH = TRINITY PARISH-ST. AUGUSTINE, who will replace expired St. Michael's-Gainesville in companionship with San Juan Evangelista in Bacuranao, Cuba. Joined by other Episcopal churches from New York, Minnesota, Connecticut, Virginia, Wyoming via the Friends of ECCuba, some 25 of the 51 Episcopal churches/missions in Cuba now serve their own parishioners and their main-street communities with fresh, purified, potable water ... a welcomed and grateful first for thirst in most of these rural churches and communities.

The US no longer has an embassy, not even an interest office, in Cuba. The granting of visas to Cubans to visit the US has become extraordinarily difficult, even for Cuban clergy with US church sponsors. They must now travel to another country to interview for their \$160 US visas and unappealable denials are becoming the norm. Those clergy and family members traveling with them who were lucky enough to have received 5-year multiple entry visas or who hold Spanish passports (e.g., Bishop Griselda, some of her family members, Dean Jose Angel, Fr. Junco) can still visit with us here more frequently until visa expiration. Will Irby and Fr. Harold Ritchie were fortunate to welcome Deacon Adreano Fuentes and his wife Yuly of Santísima Trinidad-Morón to St. Alban's-Chiefland in August. But the US is no longer granting the 5-year visa versions, only one-time entry visas from here out ... a further curtailment to the crux of companionship ... the ability to develop relationships, friendships by breaking bread together.

Indeed, we feel the Holy Spirit moving us on to continue enthusiastically with our mission vision, to overcome the discomfitures we may experience along the way, and to rejoice in the evangelism and reciprocal love with our Cuban brothers and sisters in joyful service to our Lord Christ Jesus. We are so grateful to Bishop Howard for inviting Bishop Griselda to attend our Florida Convention on January 24 and 25, 2020. We eagerly look forward to having her join us at an annual Dio ECCuba meeting and dinner after the Convention. May the spiritual breezes from the land of the palm trees flow through us in Florida and spread their song of unity and healing to and throughout our sister states in the land of amber waves of grain with purple mountains' majesty.

2019 Real Estate Summary Report

The Diocese of Florida has \$342,222,700 in insured property valued by the Church Insurance Group.

Several projects were evaluated and approved including a youth education building at St. Francis in the Field, and a capital renovation project at St. John's/Tallahassee. A major new plant is in conceptual development at Wildlight/St. Timothy's/Nassau.

The Diocese focused on generating cash flow on non-Episcopal occupied properties through leasing and holding mortgages. This income is deposited into the Nehemiah Fund which is used to help grow our denomination in areas of future opportunity.

The sale of non-strategic property is pending at 4315 23rd Avenue, Gainesville. This contract with Wilson Group was amended in July. Final re-zoning must be completed by May 31, 2020. The developer will again approach the City of Gainesville with a P.U.D. (Planned Unit Development) mixed commercial zoning change with a less dense development plan. This has been a contentious project with the Suburban Heights residents. Progress has been made and the remaining obstacle is traffic mitigation.

There were several other sales closed or pending – Ethiopian Church, 10679 Old St. Augustine Road, San Pablo, and Williston.

Leaky roof problems is a common issue in the Diocese. Emmanuel/Welaka, Christ Church/Monticello, Ruge Hall, St. Paul's by the Creek are among facilities either repaired or in need of renovation.

Ongoing exploration of property/casualty insurance cost-saving options are being examined.

Education for Ministry (EfM)

Education for Ministry is a four-year small group program designed to equip lay persons interested in furthering their own spiritual development beyond adult Sunday school classes. The program was developed by and is supervised by the University of the South, School of Theology, Sewanee.

The co-coordinators for EfM in the Diocese of Florida are Virginia Carpenter (virginia.apelian@gmail.com) and Malinda Harris (malinda61@comcast.net). The coordinators manage training events yearly so that the School of Theology, is assured that the mentors of these groups receive ongoing support to ensure a quality experience for each group member. The trainers are sent by Sewanee from around the United States. The 2019 training held at Camp Weed, held February 7-9, hosted 13 participants, and the 2020 training, to be held February 6-8, has 14 registered. The Diocese of Florida has eleven groups meeting around the diocese.

The co-coordinators field questions from around the diocese and the United States. New Episcopalians from other places call us to find locations of groups, and lay and clergy alike inquire about beginning a group in the diocese. We welcome the opportunity to further explain this outstanding program, which can benefit a parish in forming well-educated lay ministries. We offer our appreciation to the Diocese of Florida, and in particular The Rev. Cn. Dr. Douglas Dupree, The Rev. Cn. Dr. Allison, DeFoor, and Sue Engemann for their assistance.

Wes Marston remains as Co-Coordinator and has focused on disaster relief efforts when required. Wes coordinated with ERD staff with daily calls during Hurricane Dorian. Jack will continue to work with the Network Representatives in promoting Episcopal Relief & Development in their congregations.

The total of 1106 gifts were made to Episcopal Relief and Development from our diocese, congregations and individuals in the **Diocese of Florida** from 10/1/2018– 9/30/2019 (1 year) amounting to \$ 270961.70. The Diocese of Florida continues to be one of the most giving dioceses to Episcopal Relief & Development in The Episcopal Church.

Hispanic Committee Overview 2019

The Hispanic Committee for 2019 was composed of the Rev. Canon Allison Defoor and myself. We remained in communication most the year via email due to diverging schedules and time constraints.

We did however collaborate on the status of candidates to the local priesthood of at least two of of our Latino missioners, discussed budgetary issues, possible sites of Latino MInistries for the future and spoke of reconvening the Hispanic Commission, which used to be active in previous years, to help with vision casting for Hispanic ministries.

We were able to meet informally at diocesan house of two occasions to discuss the ministries at Santa Catalina and San Francisco del Campo and towards the end of 2019 were able to hold a meeting with all the clergy who are responsible for Hispanic Ministry of whose parishes host a service.

Challenges we faced during the year included the sudden retirement of Fr. Guillermo Cordoba, vicar at San Francisco del Campo after a corneal detachment, clergy coverage at missions when there is a vacancy or vacation, transition at San Francisco del Campo, as questions about a clear educational and ministry path for persons from other denominations who want to join the Episcopal Church as local priests for Hispanic Ministries.

Overall despite challenges 2019 was a year of growth and consolidation for our Hispanic Ministries. We have experienced steady growth at Santa Catalina and San Francisco. Christ Church begun a Spanish Language service under the leadership of Fr. Andreis Diaz which is off to an excellent start. St. Luke's, our first Spanish Language parish continues to be active in the Arlington area where there is an influx of Spanish Speakers.

Episcopal Chapel of the Incarnation 2020 Convention Report

The Chapel of the Incarnation, affectionately called Chapel House, is a vibrant Episcopal Christian ministry among the students, faculty, and staff in the University of Florida and Santa Fe College communities.

We are a worshipping body committed to helping people enjoy, love, and serve the Lord Jesus Christ. As a member of the global Anglican Communion of Churches, our desire is to participate in the university community as a lively center for learning, discovery, and the pursuit of wisdom that will bless and enrich our culture and world for the sake of Christ.

"If it weren't for this ministry, [my child] would have withdrawn from University of Florida freshman year. S/he was having a really difficult time before finding the Chapel. Thank you for welcoming [my child] in – it makes a huge difference." These were the words of a concerned father who contacted me a few months ago to let me know he was so grateful that his student had gotten connected at Chapel of the Incarnation. It's a poignant reminder that so many faces in the swarm of 50,000+ undergraduate and graduate students walking the campus at UF really are "sheep without a shepherd."

There has been steady growth the past year and a half in my time at the Chapel. We have seen Sunday worship bloom from a small handful in summer of 2018 to an average attendance of 38 this fall! Wednesday weekly Bible Study and dinner participation has risen from 10 to 23 on average! And new people are connecting regularly to the faith community through outreaches, service projects, and simple Christian hospitality. A rotation of a dozen generous churches provide Sunday evening dinners to feed the college crowd, and we are so thankful for not only the home-style experience, but for the partnership in building up young leaders. The future of the church is bright because ministries like Incarnation are calling, engaging, and equipping the leaders of tomorrow. Hear from a couple of current students:

"My experience at the Chapel of the Incarnation has been among the most formative of my college career. It has been one of my greatest honors serving on the student elected Missions Board for two consecutive years. Coming in as a freshman, I was on the search for the next place I would make my home, as many do when they begin a college career. I found the Chapel of the Incarnation to be a place where I could be myself, grow my faith, and surround myself with good people who cared for me. I can confidentially say that the people I have met over these four short years will be lifelong friends. Bishop Howard, by pastoral letter distributed to clergy of the Diocese dated September 20, 2017—following the hurricanes which caused significant damage in Florida, including our diocese, wrote, in part: "In light of the stress and anxiety of the past two weeks, this is a moment...for us to pause, take a deep breath and care for ourselves". He made several proposals designed to do that, including the reconstitution of the then inactive Pastoral Care Commission and charged the commission "with assisting me in providing pastoral care ministry for you and your families". The Commission believes that this charge includes providing resources for the clergy in their pastoral care for the people in their congregations, so that the entire diocese benefits and is spiritually strengthened

Having met face-to-face during the Fall Clergy Conference of 2017, members of the Commission consulted with each other thereafter by telephone and email to prepare its recommendations to Bishop Howard. A report of those recommendations was submitted to the Bishop on Tuesday of Easter Week, 2018.

Although the Chair has been in occasional email communications with the other members, the Commission has not met during calendar year 2019.

Prison Ministry:

During this last year we he continued to minister to the inmates and staff of the Florida Department of Corrections.

A new Secretary has been appointed to the Department. Secretary Mark Inch is a retired Major General, U.S. Army, and served as the head of the military prison system. He brings a wealth of knowledge to the job and from all indications that I have seen, is dedicated to improving the environment of both inmates and staff.

We have ministered to more than 10,000 inmates last year, between services and personal visits. This is about 10% of all inmates held by FDOC. We are currently in 15 of the 30 prisons in our diocese. We involve all orders, Bishop, Priest, Deacon, and Laity in this ministry.

This year, we returned to the Main Unit at Suwannee CI with 3 services.

For those, like me, who are numbers oriented, here are some for the western end of the diocese.

8 prisons, 196 services, 3090 attendees, 2576 communicants. I should mention that there are only 184 Episcopalians in the entire Department of Corrections.

As always, we still need your support as students can't fund what they receive.

- Our main events each week are Sunday services at 3pm and Thursday evening discipleship group at 7pm. But, key to our increasing health is our micro-groups which help ensure every student is known and growing in their walk with Jesus.
- A plaque on the wall calls us 'the center of Christian Culture on campus' and it is becoming more and more true. The donations based coffee house we host keeps the building full when Grace Mission's afterschool program or other discipleship programs aren't running. We also hosted the joint outreach of 14 ministries to FSU to new students in August.
- In 2019 Attendance has grown by every mark. Our fall Sunday average attendance was 15.75 up from 12.58 in the spring and 11 in 2018.
