Beth and her husband Jeff reside in St Johns County and together have 5 children and one grandchild.



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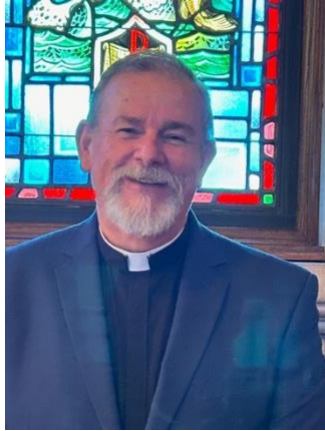


The Reverend William Stokes
